



# Abbey College Ramsey

## Admissions Policy 2027

The admission arrangements set out in this document are for Abbey College Ramsey, a secondary school within Meridian Trust.

## 1. Introduction

- 1.1 As an Academy, the Governing Body are responsible for establishing the Admission Criteria and Oversubscription Criteria; the Governing Body have agreed to follow the Admissions and Oversubscription Criteria set by Cambridgeshire County Council. These criteria have not been changed by the Governing Body following the establishment of the Academy. The responsibility for the administration of the Admissions process remains with the Local Authority (LA).
- 1.2 Please note that the address used for the purpose of admission is the child's usual place of residence. Applications based on future addresses can only be considered up to 6 teaching weeks before the child is expected to take up the place and upon confirmation of tenancy or exchange of contracts with details of the proposed completion date. Parents are expected to notify the Academy of any changes of address as this may affect the allocation of a place. Further guidance on this issue is available from the Academy.

## 2. Admissions into Year 7 for September 2027

- 2.1 Catchment Area: Children living in the area served by the following primary schools fall within the catchment area:
  - Ramsey Junior School
  - Bury CofE Primary School
  - Warboys Community Primary School
  - Ashbeach Primary School
  - Upwood Primary School
  - Somersham Primary School
  - Earith Primary School
  - St Helens Primary School Bluntisham
- 2.2 In the event that applications to Abbey College exceed the PAN (Published Admission Number) of 210, students will be allocated a place on the basis of the Academy's published over subscription criteria. (See point 4).

There is no automatic transfer to a secondary school, an application must be made. Offer letters will be issued by the LA on the National Offer Date (1 March 2027). Late applications, i.e. those submitted between 1 November 2026 and 31 March 2027, will be processed on 1 April 2027. For further information and specific dates, please refer to the full scheme for secondary co-ordination, available from the LA Admissions Team

- 2.4 Parents wishing to visit the academy prior to making an application are welcome to do so. An Open Evening will be held in October for prospective Year 6 students, details of which can be found on the Academy website.
- 2.5 Visits during the academy day are also available, by appointment only. However, such visits may not be possible to organise at short notice and it should be emphasised that such visits are not interviews and do not affect any decision regarding the availability of places. Please contact the Academy to make arrangements.

### **3. In-Year admissions**

If you are applying for an In-Year place, i.e., you want a place at Abbey College for any student after a September start, you must follow the procedures on the Cambridgeshire County Council website:

### **4. Over subscription**

4.1 The School Admissions Code requires that children whose statement of special educational needs (SEN) or Education, Health and Care plan names the school sits before the over-subscription criteria.

1. Looked after children and children who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to adoption, a child arrangement order, or special guardianship order. (A looked after child is a child who is in the care of a local authority in England, or is being provided with accommodation by a local authority in England in the exercise of their social services functions).
2. Children who appear to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted. (A child is regarded as having been in state care in a place outside of England if they were accommodated by a public authority, a religious organisation or any other provider of care whose sole purpose is to benefit society.)
3. Children who live in the catchment area and have a sibling who currently attends the academy and will still be attending the academy on the proposed admission date. For the purpose of these criteria, siblings are defined as children living in the same home and includes students in the sixth form.
4. Children who live in the catchment area who attend the primary schools within it.
5. Children who live in the catchment area.
6. Other children having a sibling who currently attends the academy and will still be attending the academy on the proposed admission date. For the purpose of these criteria, siblings are defined as children living in the same home and includes students in the sixth form.
7. Children who live outside the catchment area who have a sibling at the academy at the time of admission.
8. Children who live outside the catchment area, but nearest the school as measured by a straight line.

- 4.2 In cases of equal merit, priority will go first to children who are in care (in the care of Social Services) and then the children living nearest the school according to the shortest available travel route.
- 4.3 A full definition appears in the LA admission booklet for parents. All preferences are treated equally. For families who live outside the area covered by the Cambridgeshire mapping system, distances are determined using a combination of local maps and on-line resources.
- 4.4 The application form must be returned to the LA Admissions Team who will then contact parents preferred schools to determine the availability of a school place. The Admissions Team will then write to confirm the details of the school at which a place is to be offered and, where appropriate, a suitable start date.
- 4.5 Where the Admissions Team is unable to meet any preferences expressed a place will be offered at the next nearest alternative school with places available.

## **5. Reserve Lists and Appeals Admissions Policy 2027**

For transfer to secondary school, as part of the co-ordinated scheme for secondary admission, when an application is refused, the child's details are automatically placed on a reserve list for the year group, ranked according to the oversubscription criteria. The LA Admissions Team holds this reserve list on behalf of the governing body until 31<sup>st</sup> December.

- 5.2 Where an In-Year application is refused the child's details will be held on the reserve list for the appropriate year group, by the LA Admissions Team on behalf of the Governing Body for a period of one term following the term for which the place was refused.
- 5.3 The parent of any child who is refused a place at the academy has a right of appeal to an independent Appeals Panel. The academy follows the published appeals procedure set out by the LA:

## **Admissions Post 16**

Applications for Admissions to Ramsey Gatehouse Sixth Form (Years 12 and 13) should be through MyChoice16 platform. The academy offers the following courses in the Sixth Form:

- 3 A levels
- A mixture of AAQ/BTECs and A Level courses

## **Entry Requirements**

All students who wish to join Ramsey Gatehouse Sixth Form must meet a minimum entry requirement of five grade 4s or above (including English Language and Maths), with further specific course entry requirements being set by the department (these can be found in the prospectus).

If better than predicted GCSE grades are achieved, the subject package offered may be reviewed. Conversely, if GCSE grades are lower than anticipated then a meeting with the Head of Sixth Form must be arranged before the start of the Autumn term in September.

### Admission number

Please note that admission to Ramsey Gatehouse Sixth Form is not the same as admission onto individual courses, which may be full, or have not run as they failed to attract sufficient numbers. In such cases, applicants will be advised of alternative options.

Entry will **not** be determined by a formal interview, but an informal guidance meeting will be held to advise students on appropriate course selections and expectations. Those who have a statement of special educational needs and fulfil the entrance requirement will be admitted.

Where required the oversubscription criteria below will be applied. Priority will be given in the following order:

- Looked after children and children who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to adoption, a child arrangement order, or special guardianship order. (A looked after child is a child who is in the care of a local authority in England, or is being provided with accommodation by a local authority in England in the exercise of their social services functions).
- Children who appear to have been in state care outside of England and ceased to be in state care as a result of being adopted. (A child is regarded as having been in state care in a place outside of England if they were accommodated by a public authority, a religious organisation or any other provider of care whose sole purpose is to benefit society.)
- Students with a sibling at the academy at the time of admission
- Other students who meet the entry requirements

Priority will be given to students living nearest the school as measured by a straight line. The distance, for admissions purposes, is measured using the straight-line distance from the reference point of the home to the main pupil entrance to the academy. These distances will be produced by the LA Admissions team for the academy.

Parents and students have a right to appeal against any decision refusing a Sixth Form place at the Academy. Appeals must be addressed to the Headteacher and will be heard by an independent panel within 40 school days of the appeal being lodged.
