seemed to enjoy the

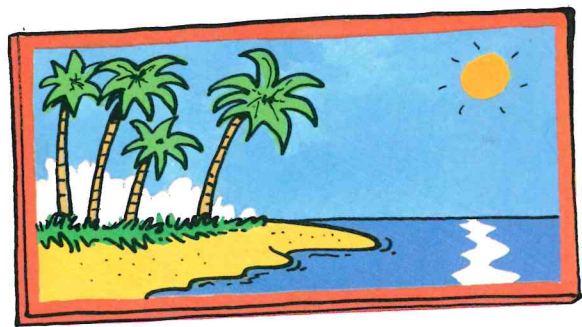

felt very fed up.

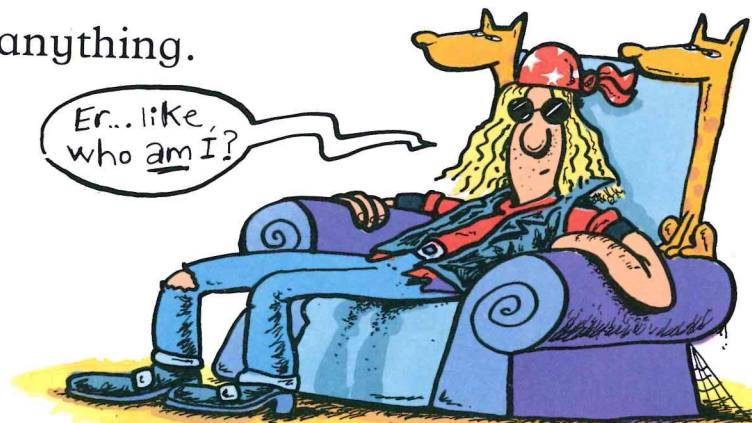


They wished they were on holiday.

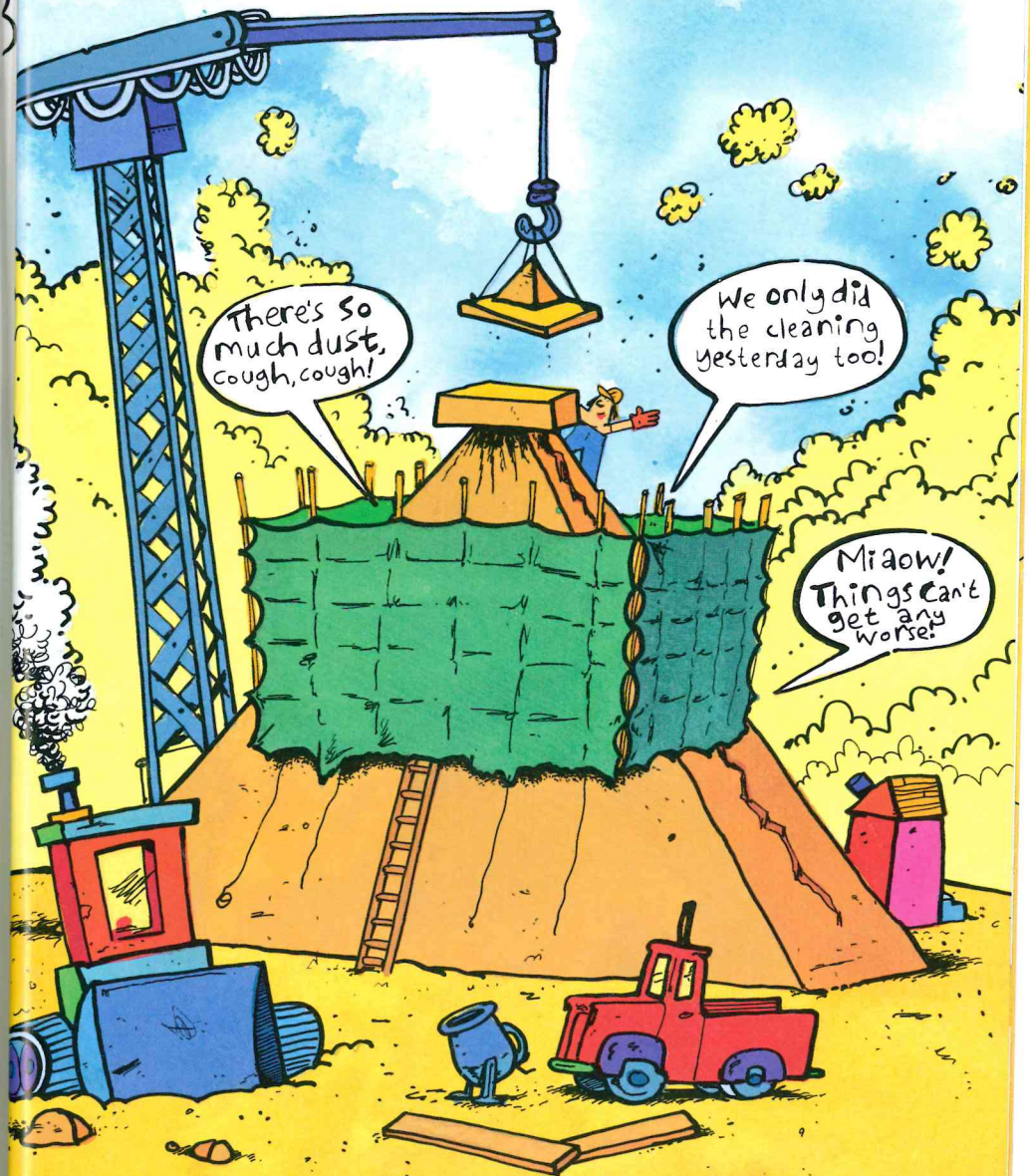


Just think

were very wrapped up in their work!



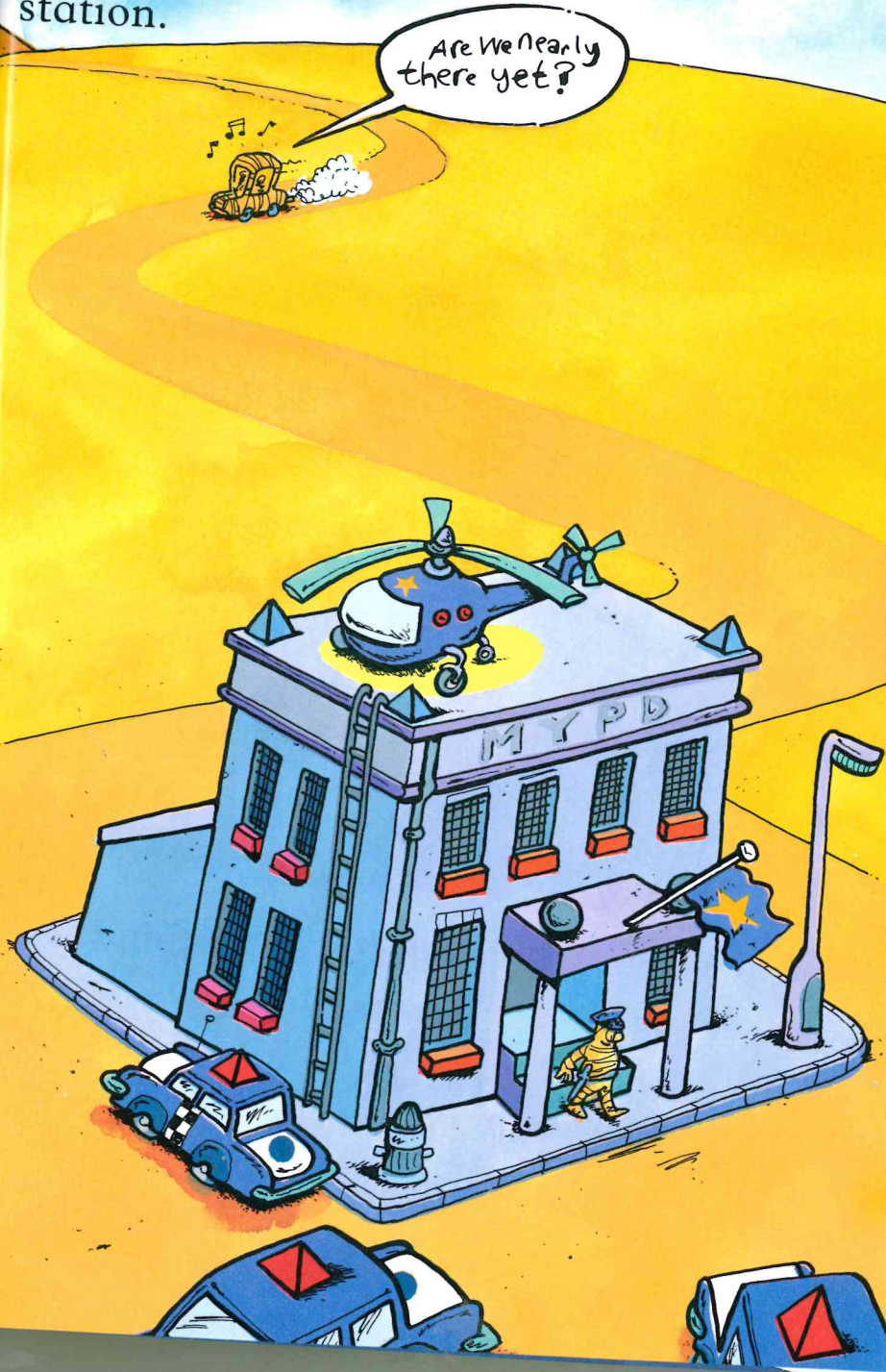
That was enough for the Mummies. They decided it was time to take their guest out. So they all jumped in the mummy car.

Mummy Mummy asked if anyone had reported a missing man. But the mummy cops couldn't help. They only dealt with missing mummies, not musical men with missing memories.



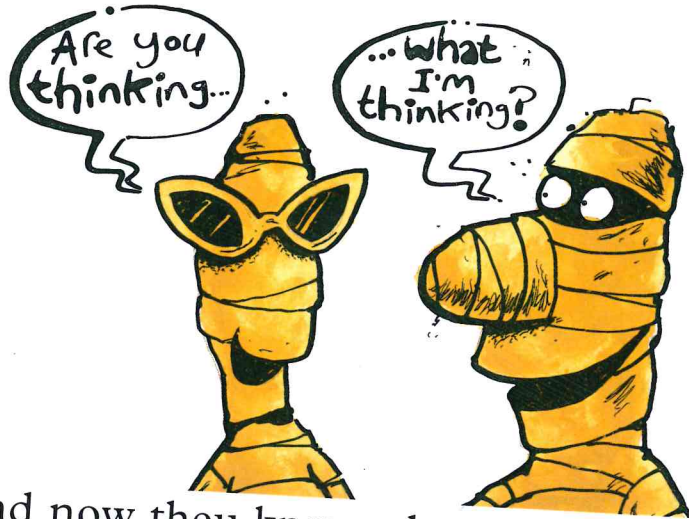
It was true, their guest was very musical . . .



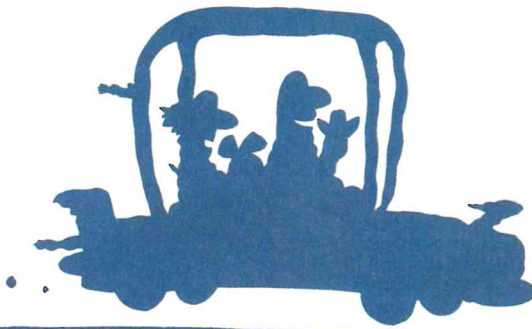


The Mummies looked at each other.

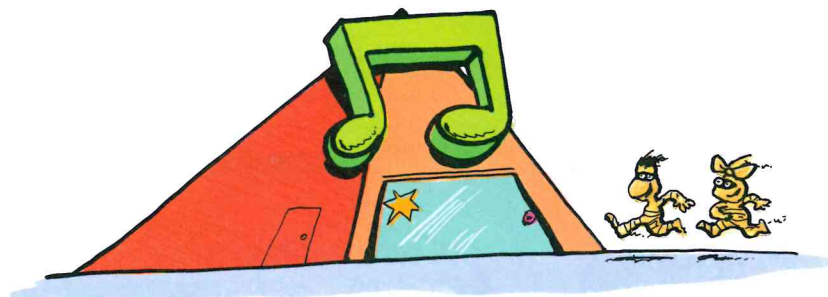
They were in complete harmony.

great time!





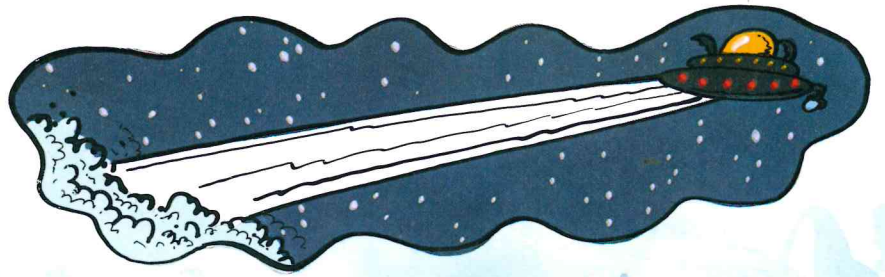
Oh well, it's too late now!
