

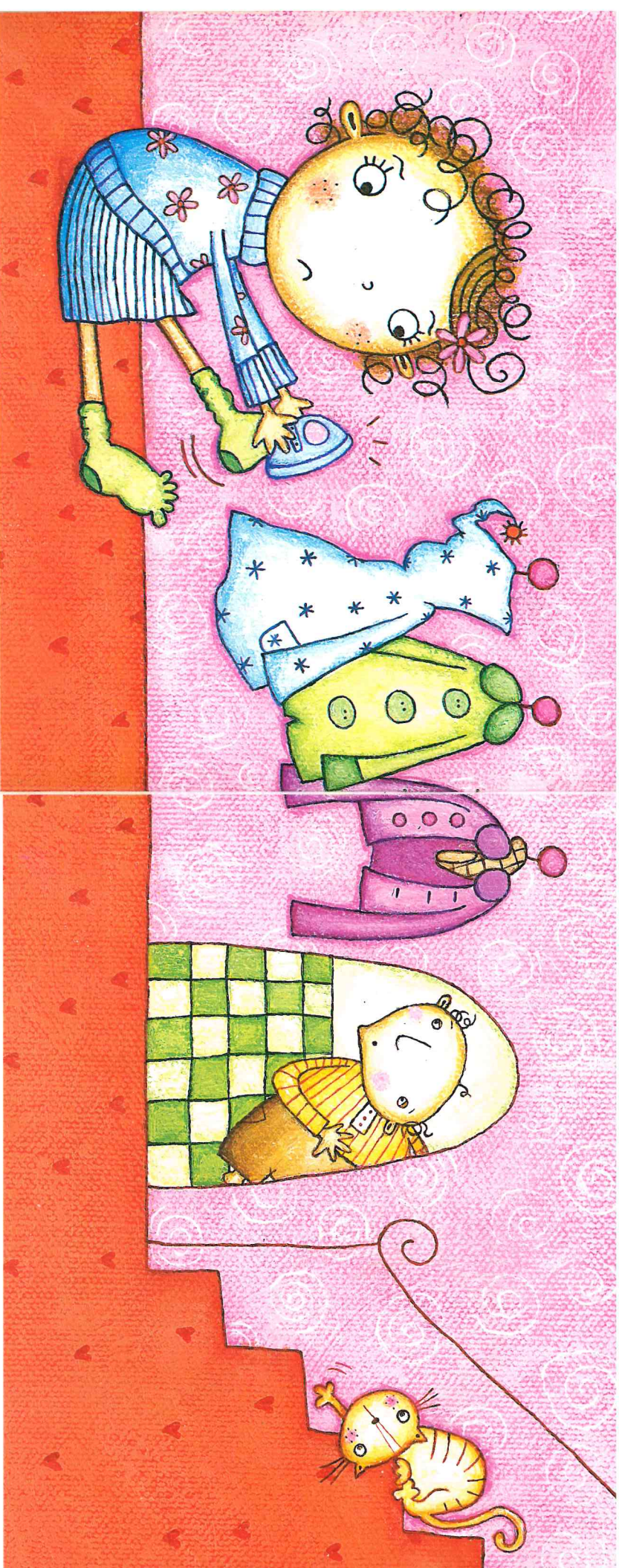


New Blue Shoes

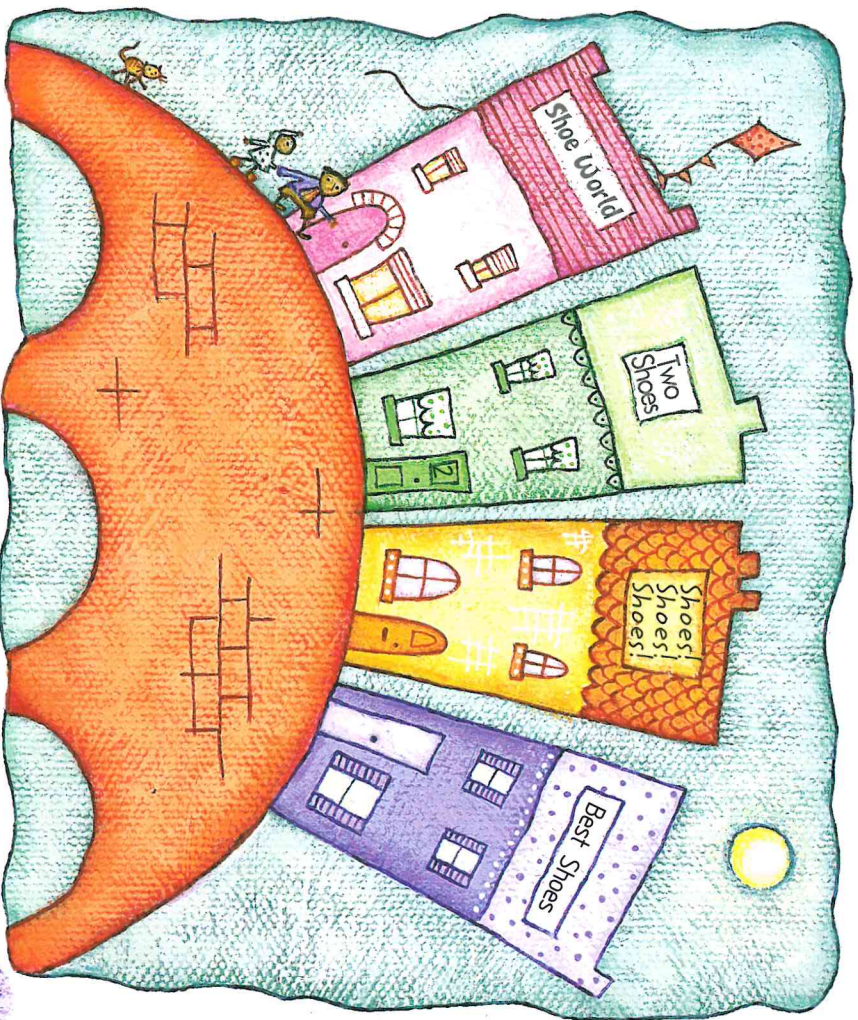
"My blue shoes are too small,"

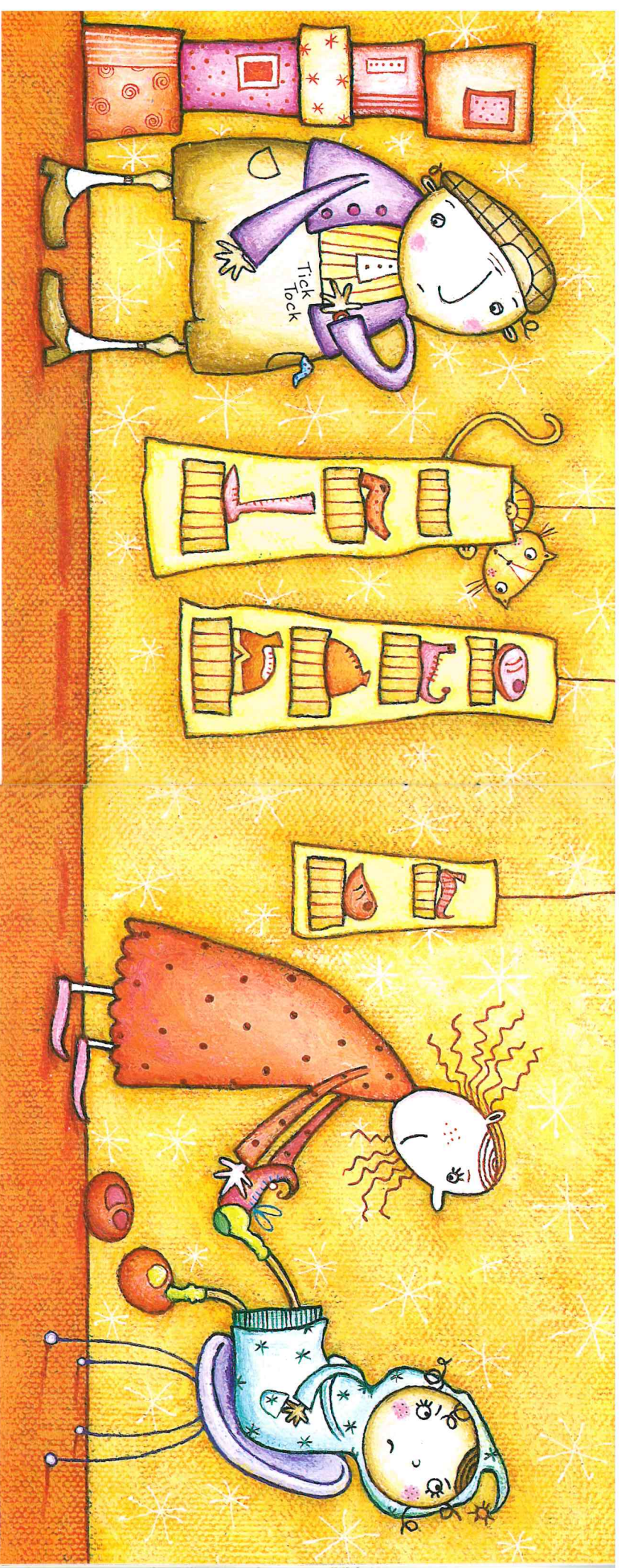
So they went into the

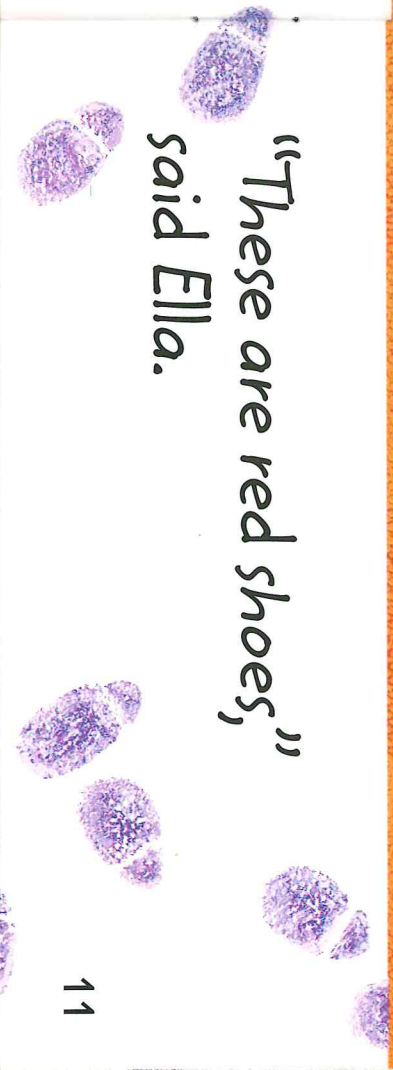
In the next shop there

Play a game

Find the colour

This game will help your child recognise colour words and read them on sight.

- On page 2, put your finger on the word 'blue' without saying it. Ask your child to find things in your room that are the same colour.
- Repeat the game with other colours from the story (yellow, pink and red).

Other ideas

- Ask your child to look at the pictures and re-tell the story as if he/she was the little cat.
- Ask your child to draw a self-portrait and to label his/her clothes by colour.
- Point out the rhyme, 'blue shoe'. Find other things that rhyme with different colours, e.g. red head, black sack and so on.
