To a little warm bed.








Benjamin tucked Peg under his arm,

Horse played with her foal.




The cat and her kittens

To need her and love her.




Benjamin gently put Peg on the ground.

She *hopped*




And she *flopped*

With only one leg.'


And the others felt sorry

For poor little Peg.




Benjamin Bottomly said, 'Don't cry!

Soon you'll be singing a sweet lullaby.




You shall have a family, dear little Peg,
For you don't need a leg to sit on an egg.'




So Benjamin Bottomly

Asked here and there:


'Does anyone have any eggs to spare?'

And I'll feed it my corn.'




I think it's starting to crack...
