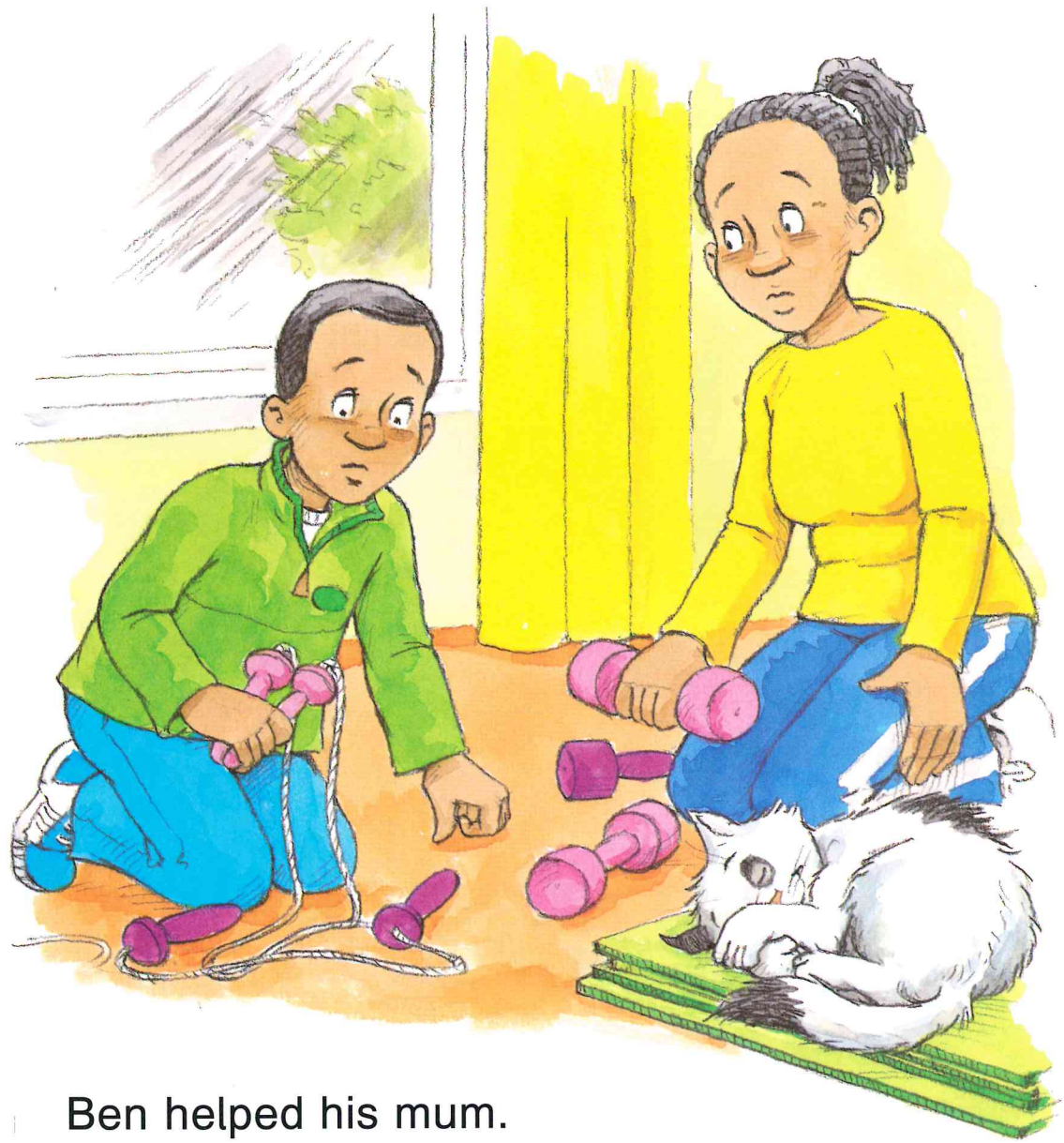
The wind had blown hard all day.

It rattled the tiles on the roofs.







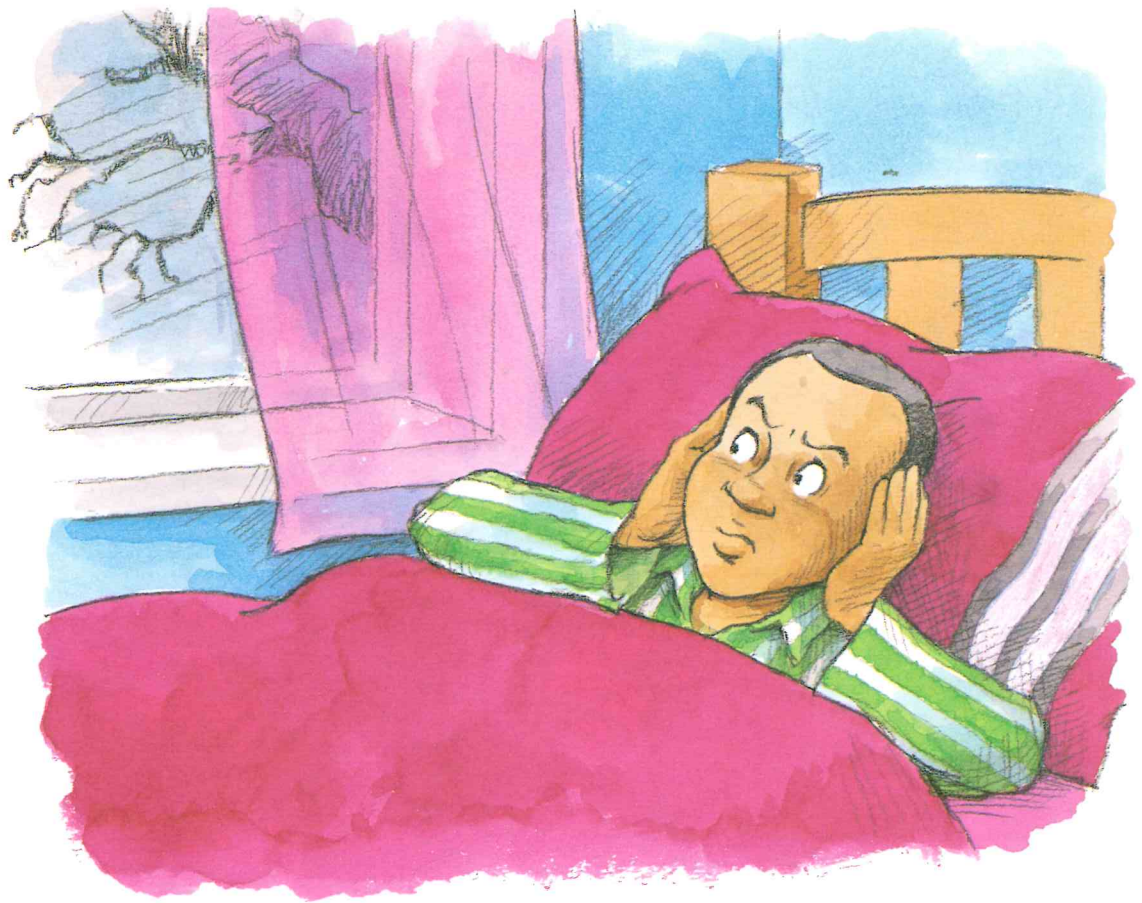
It was too wet and windy

she said.

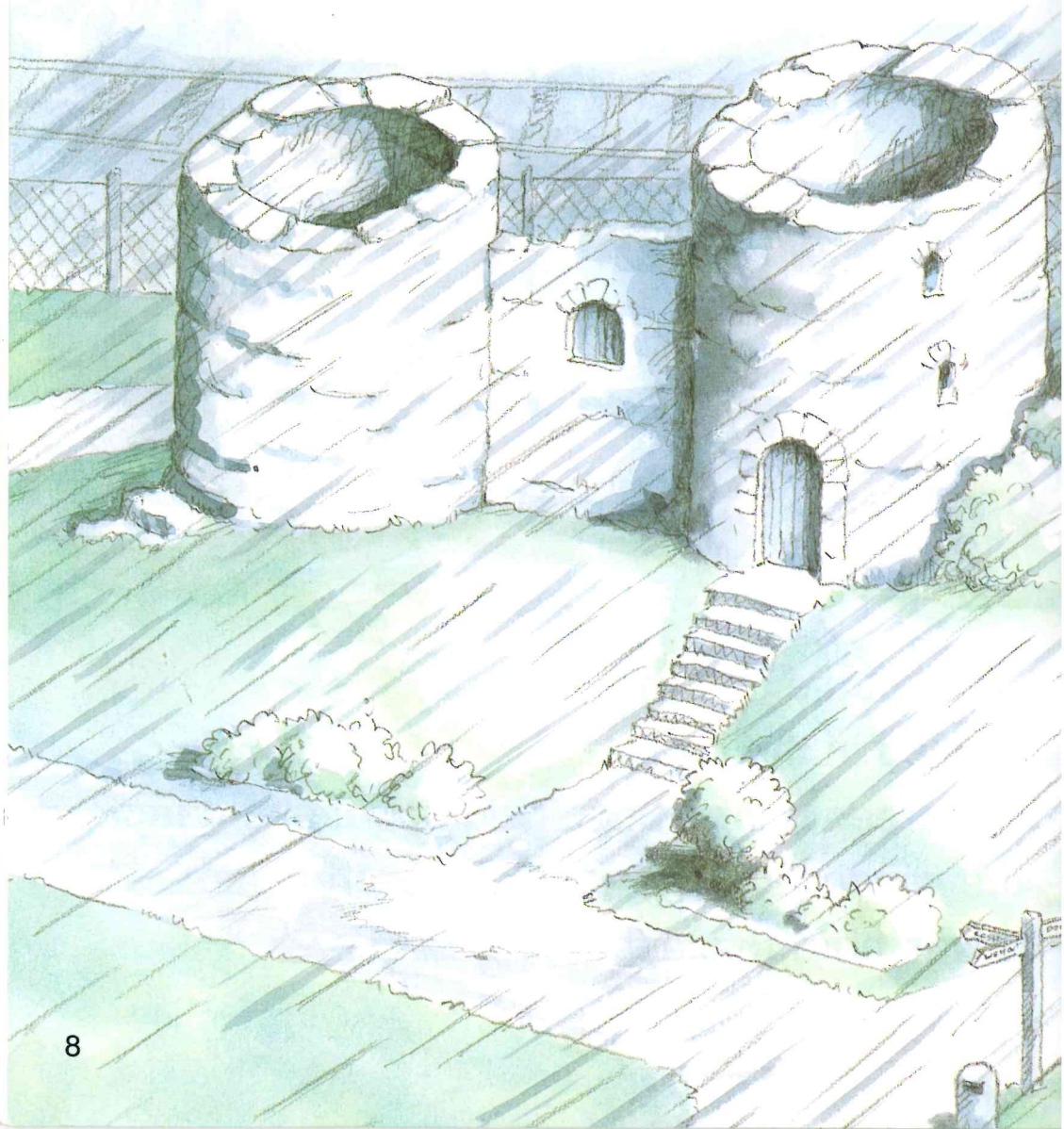


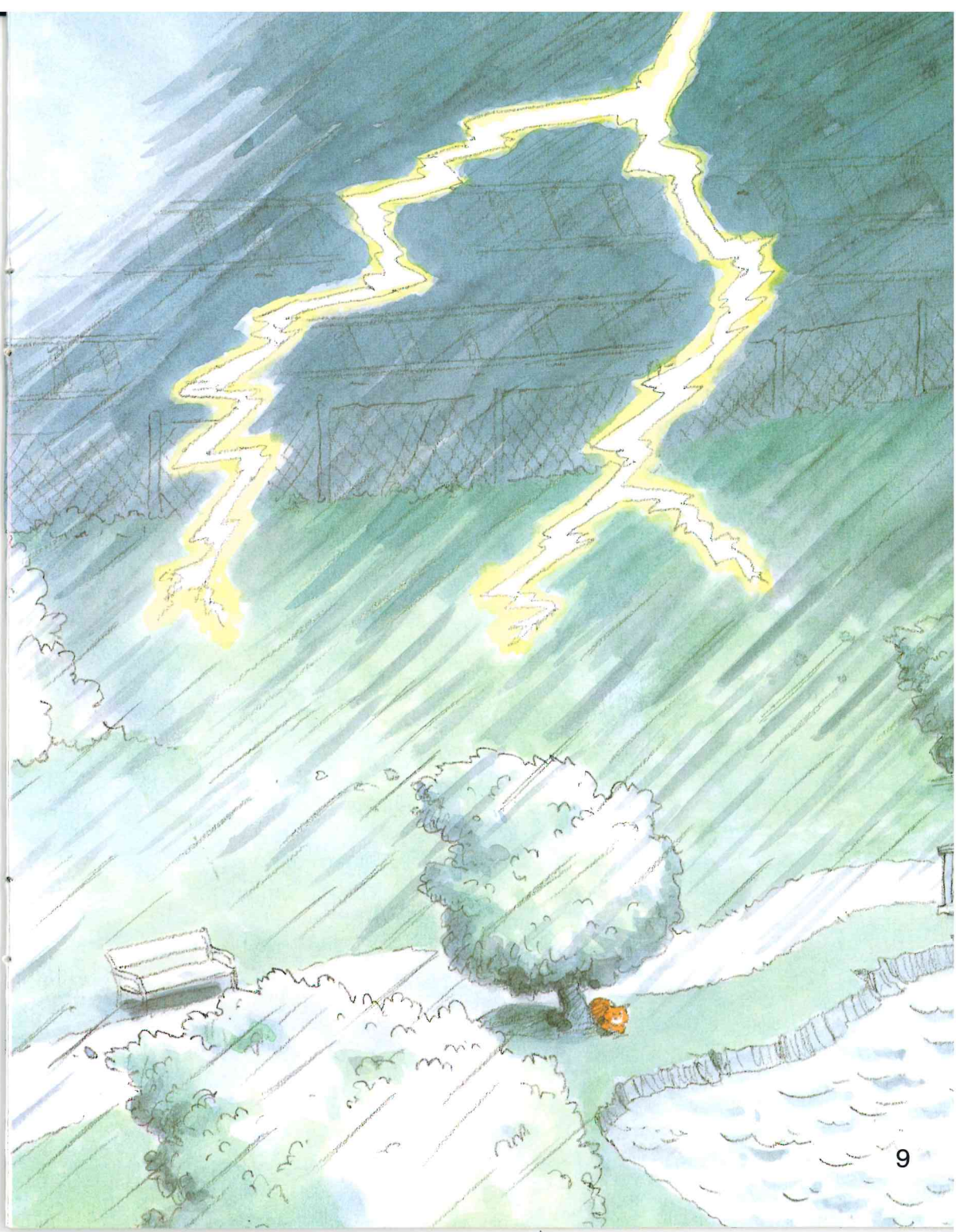
Sam made a camp under the table.
“No rain in here,” she smiled.



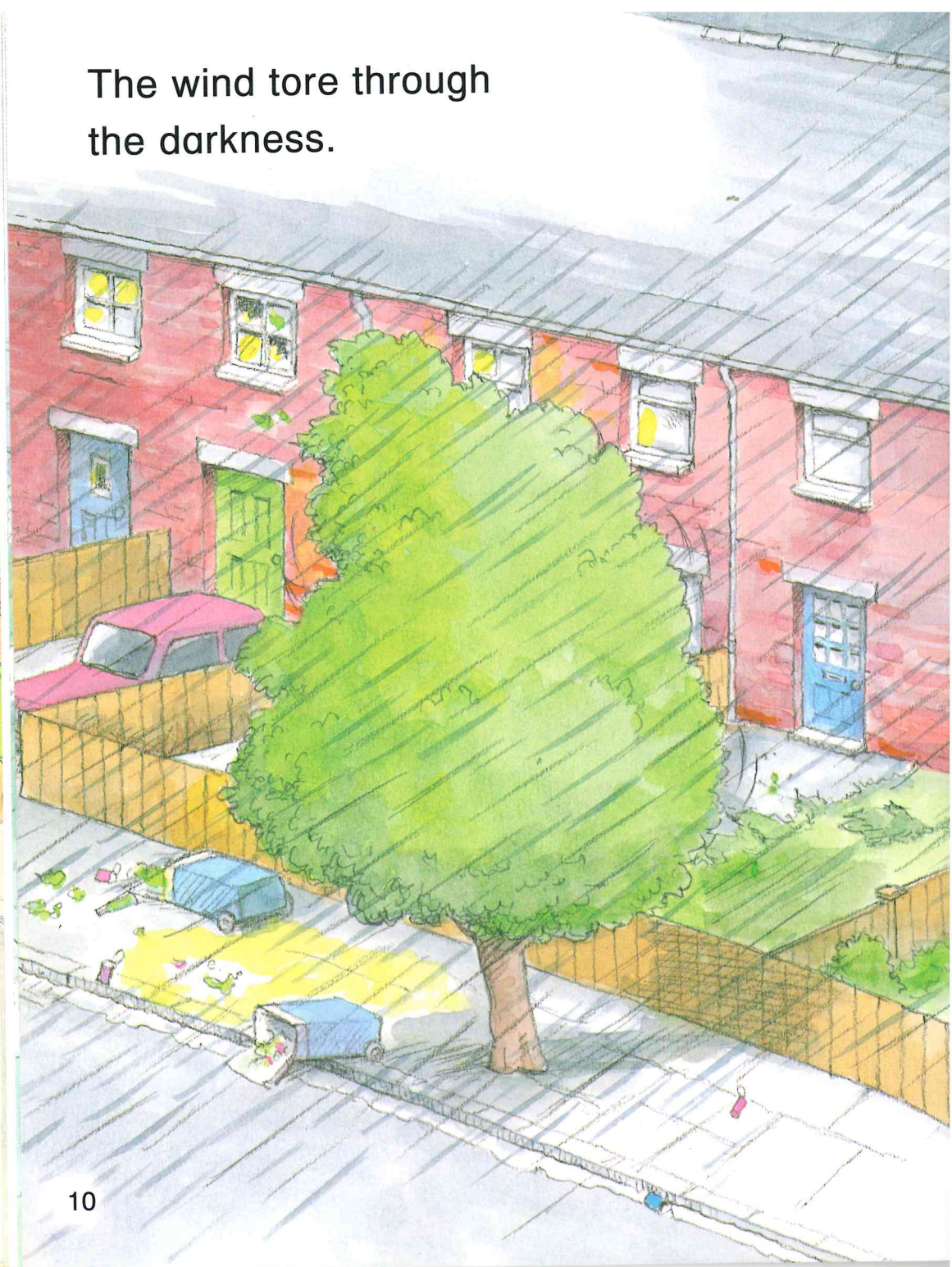
Night came and the wind

It was hard to sleep.

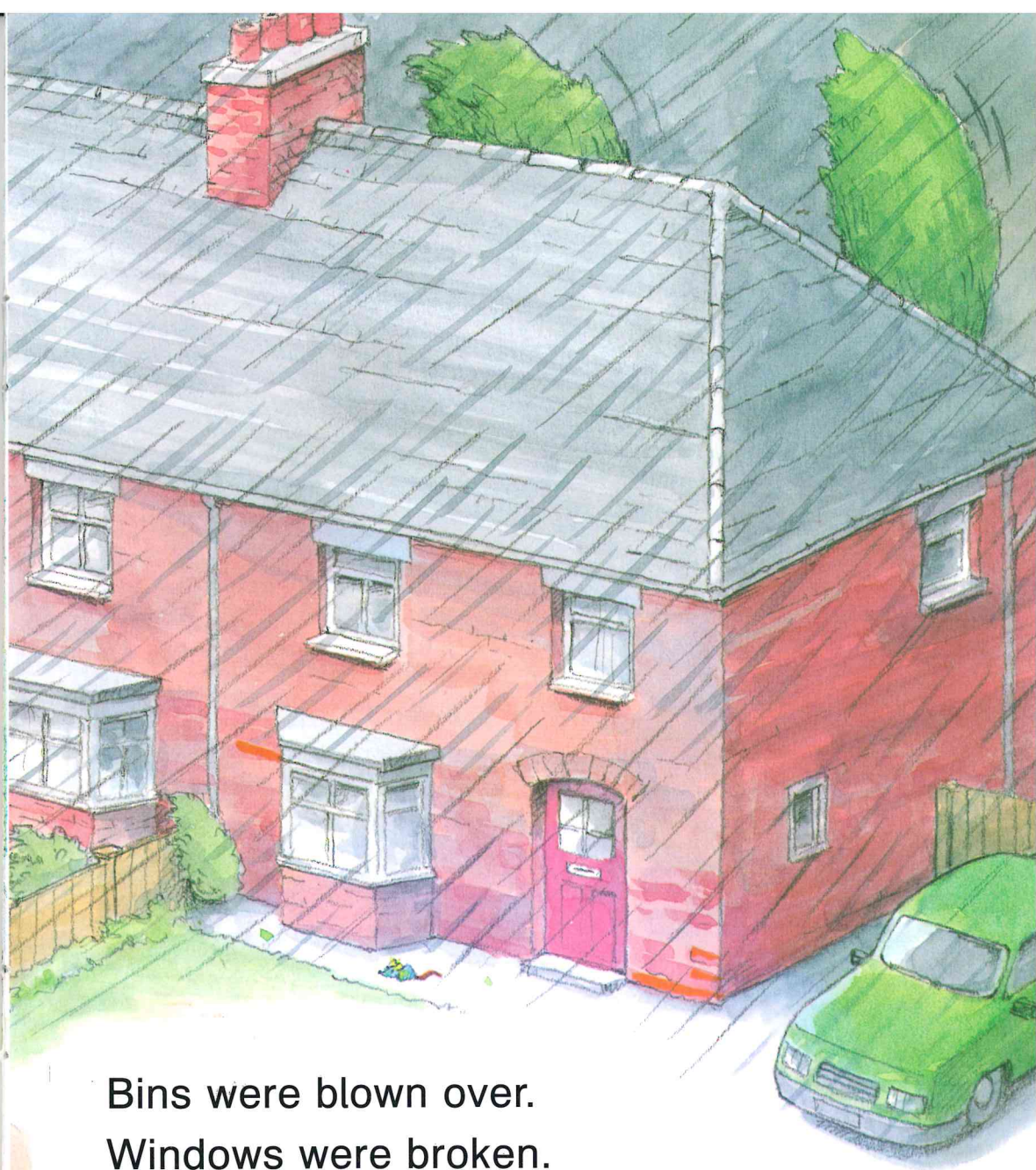
In the middle of the night

that got in their way.



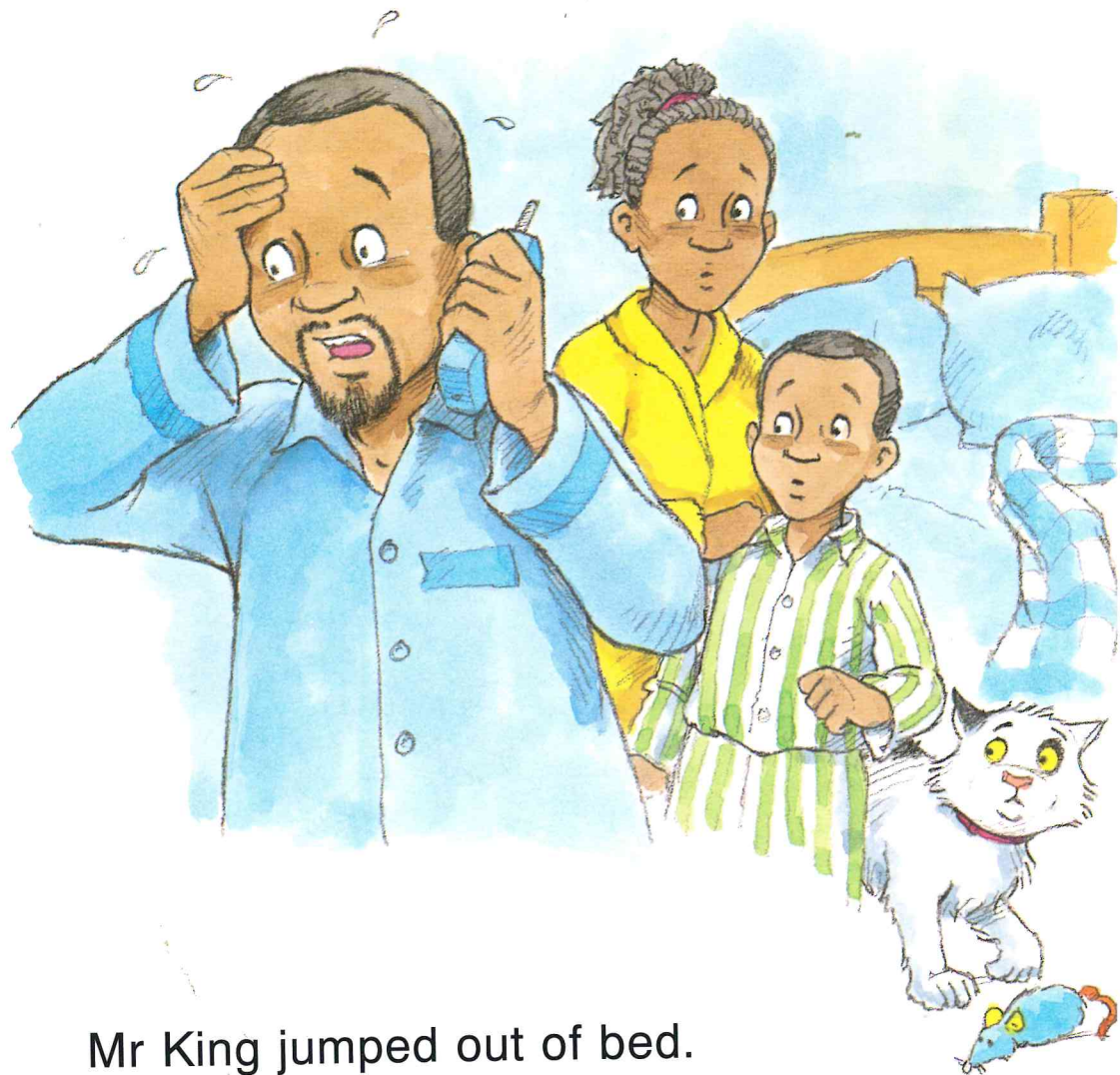
The thunder still roared
and the wind still howled.




The noise of the storm woke Ben.

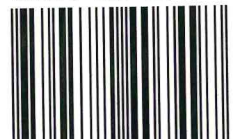
