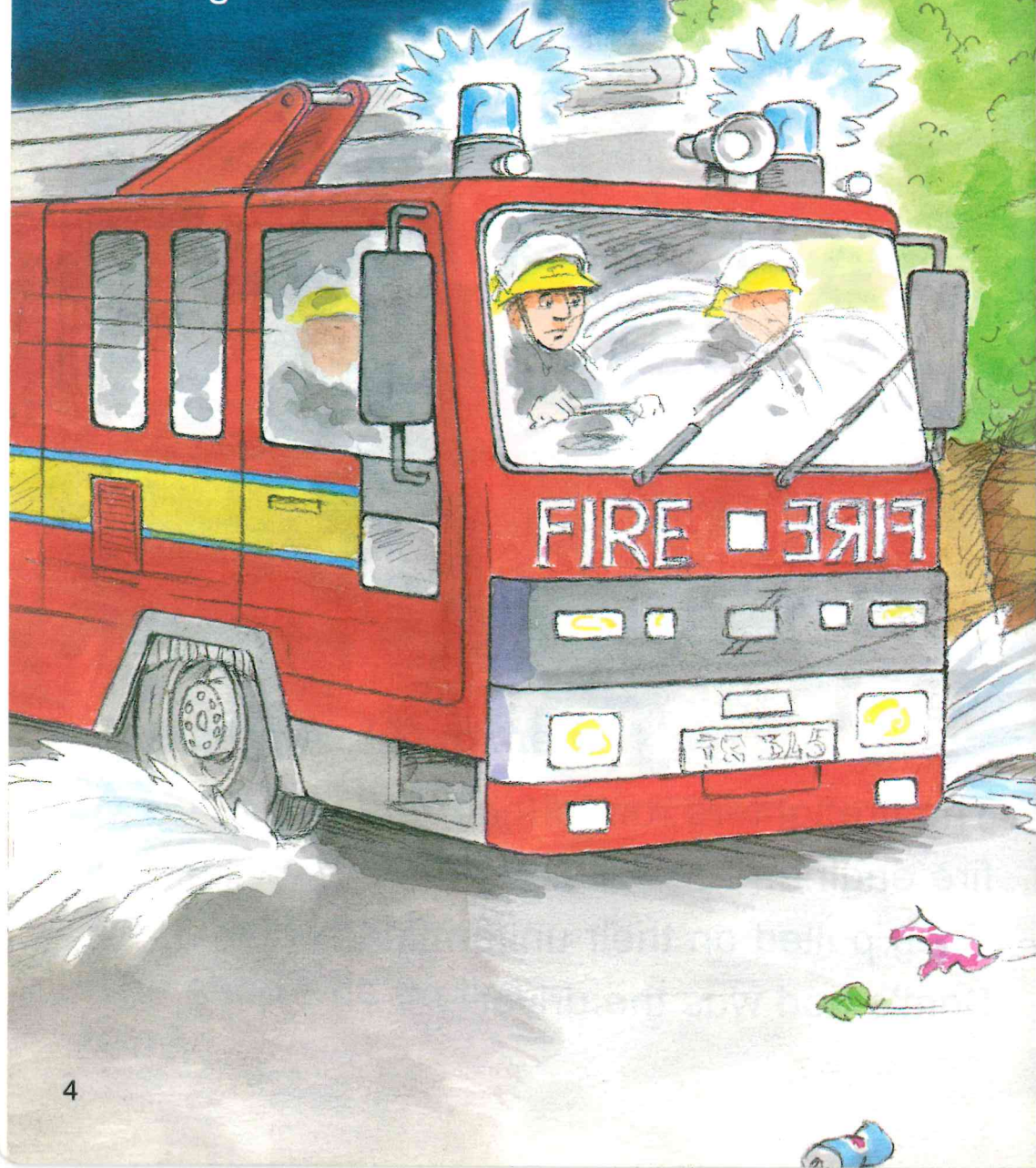


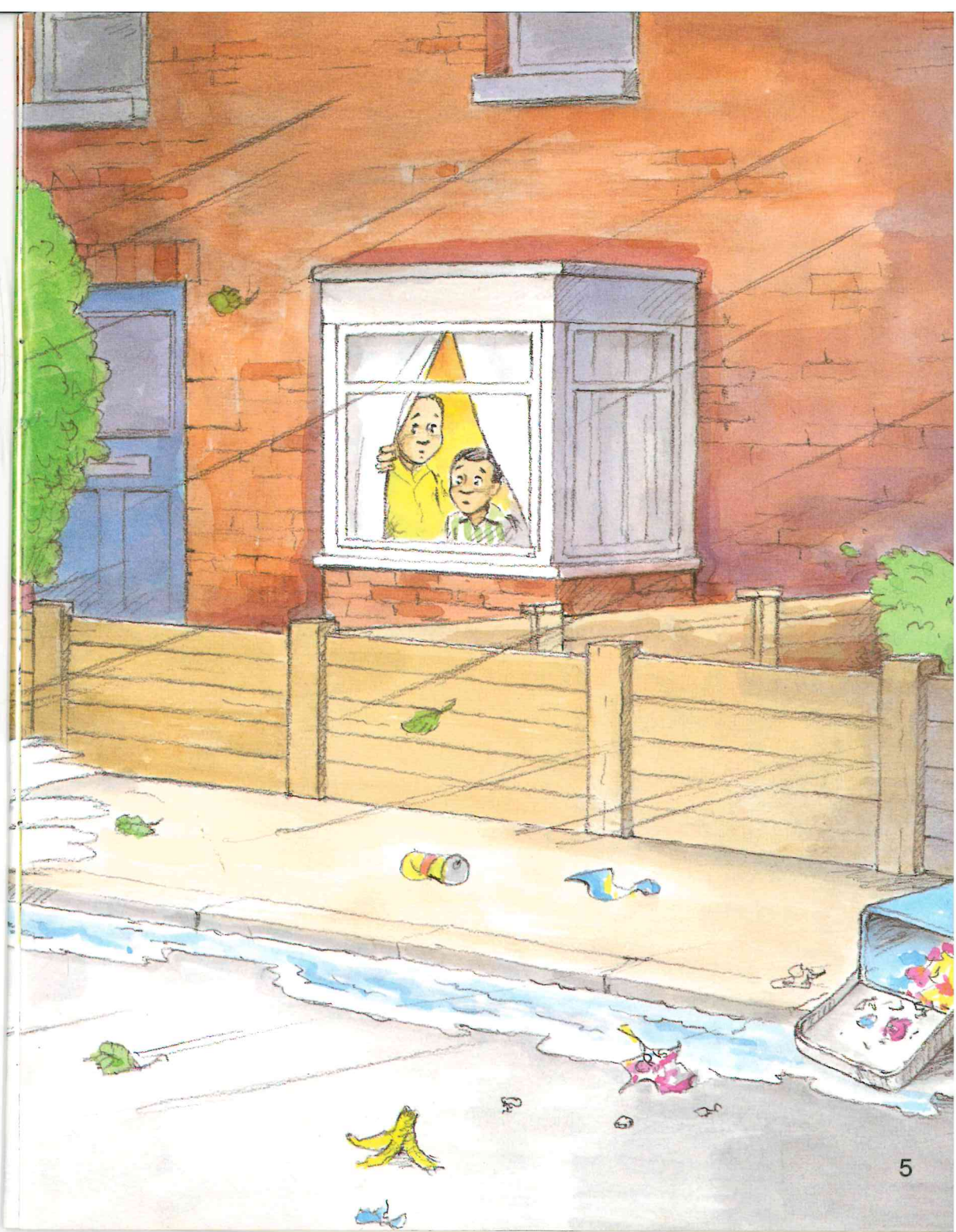
There was a fire in the park.

The shop was on fire.



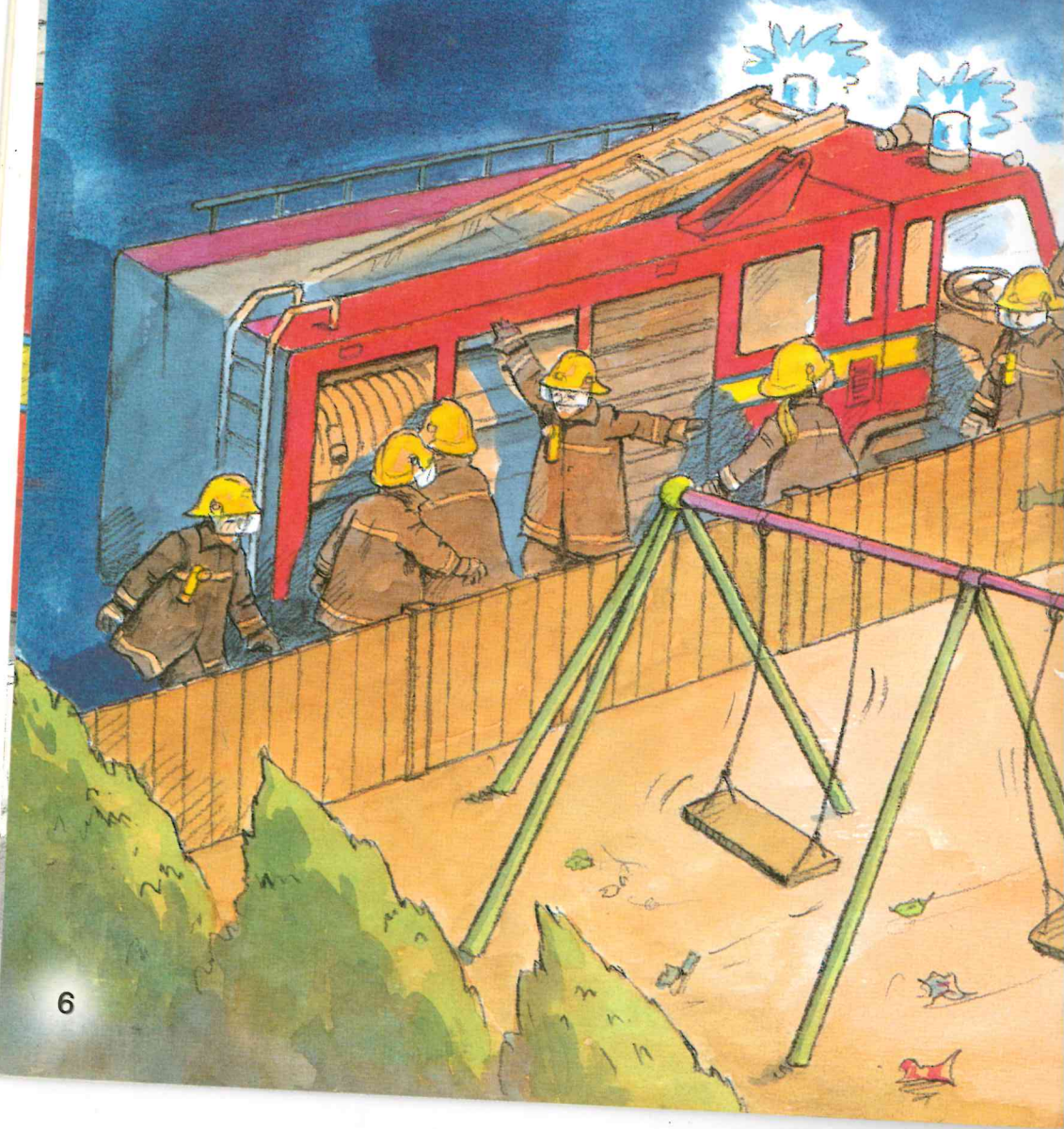
The firefighters ran to their

Flames leapt into the air.





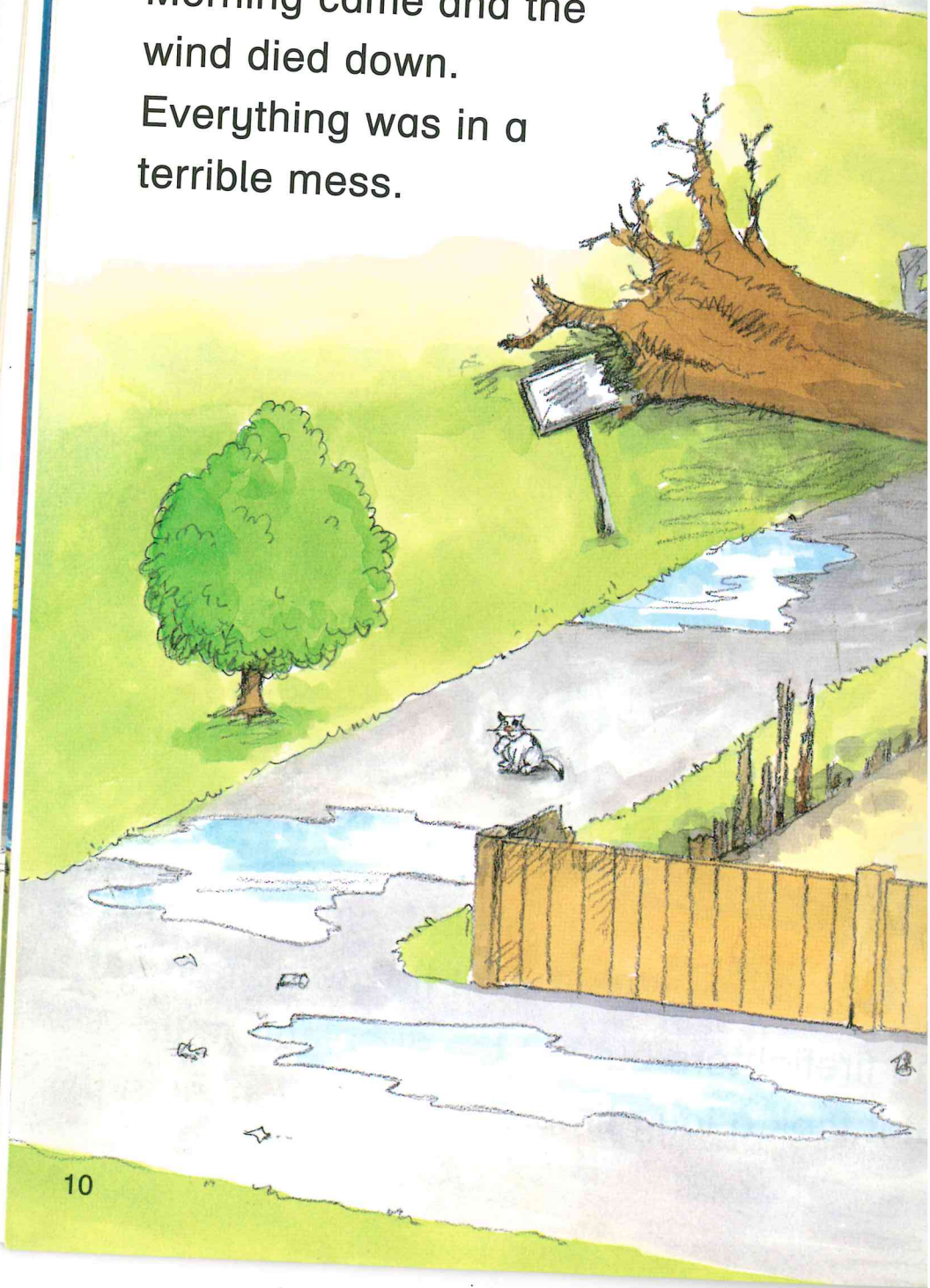


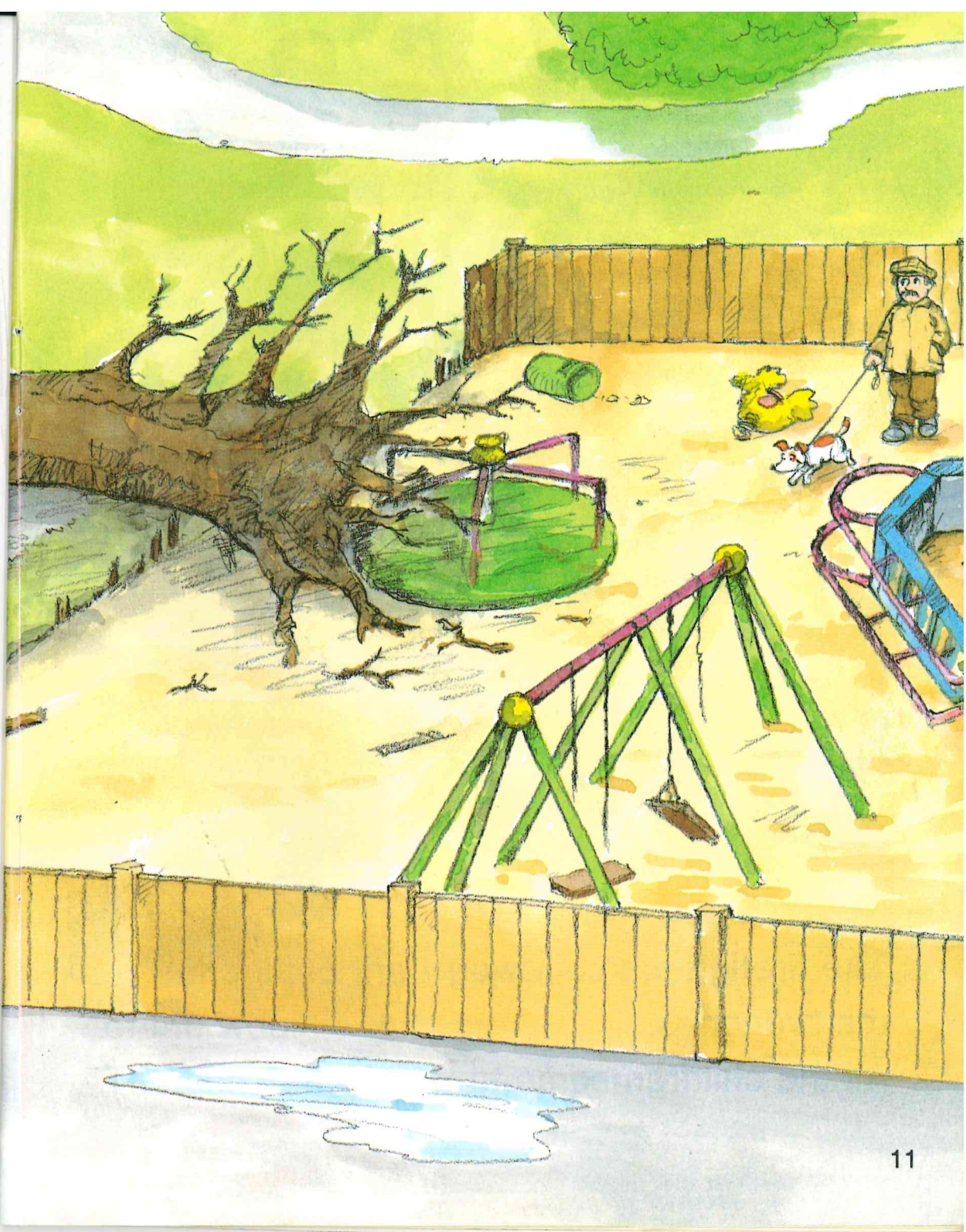
The wind almost blew

“We will run too.”

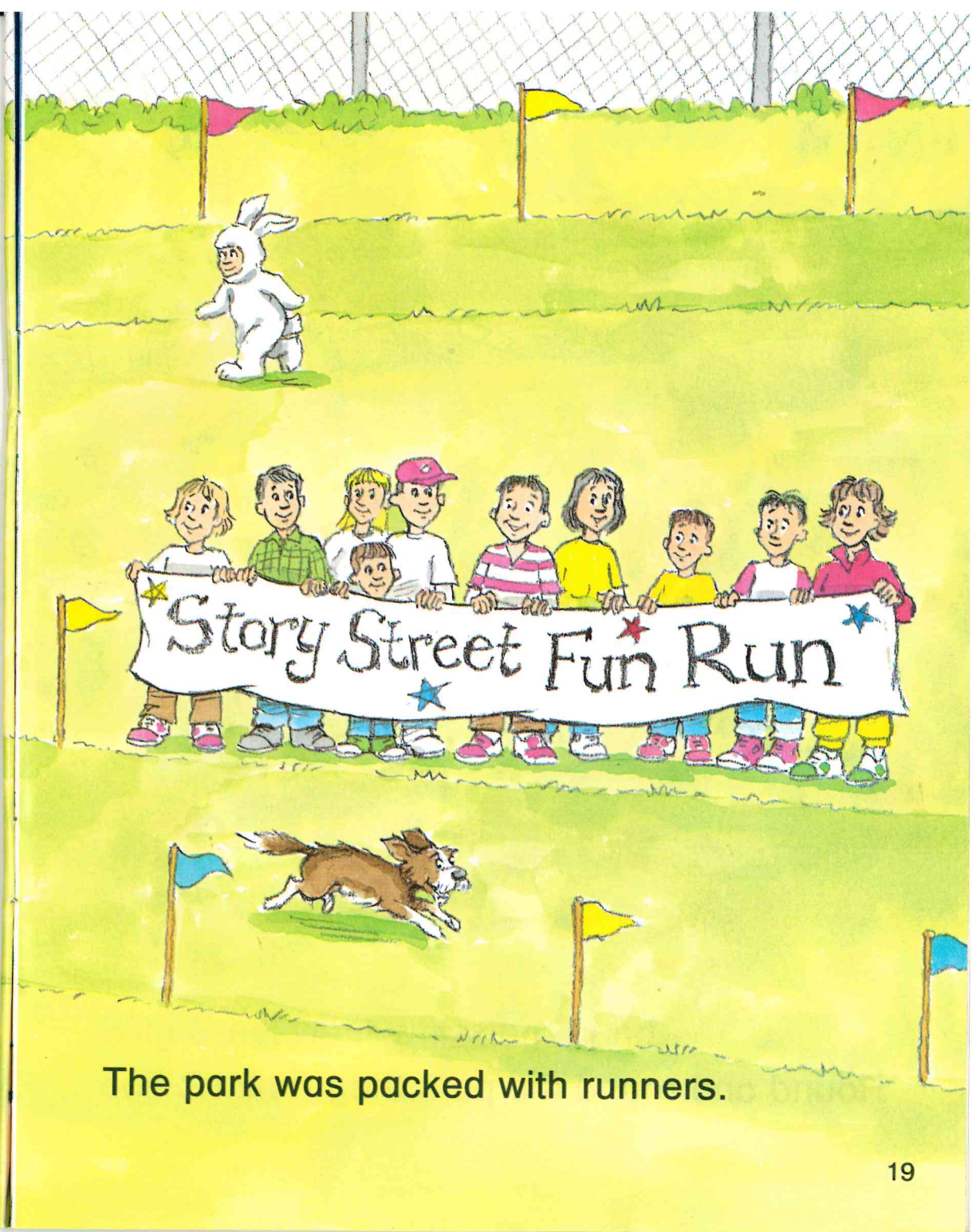
“So will we,” said the firefighters.



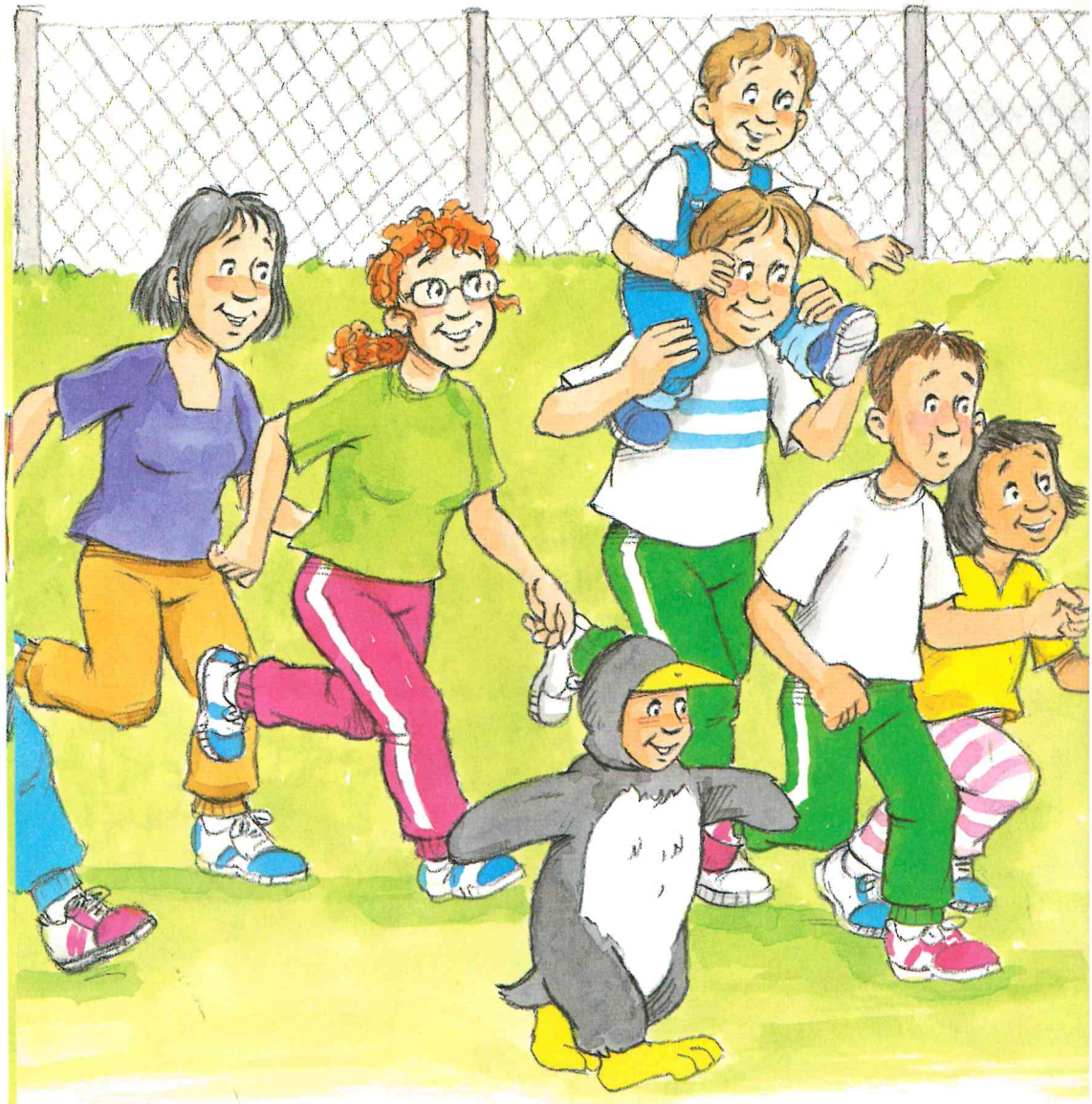
Lots of people wanted to help.

The park was packed with runners.



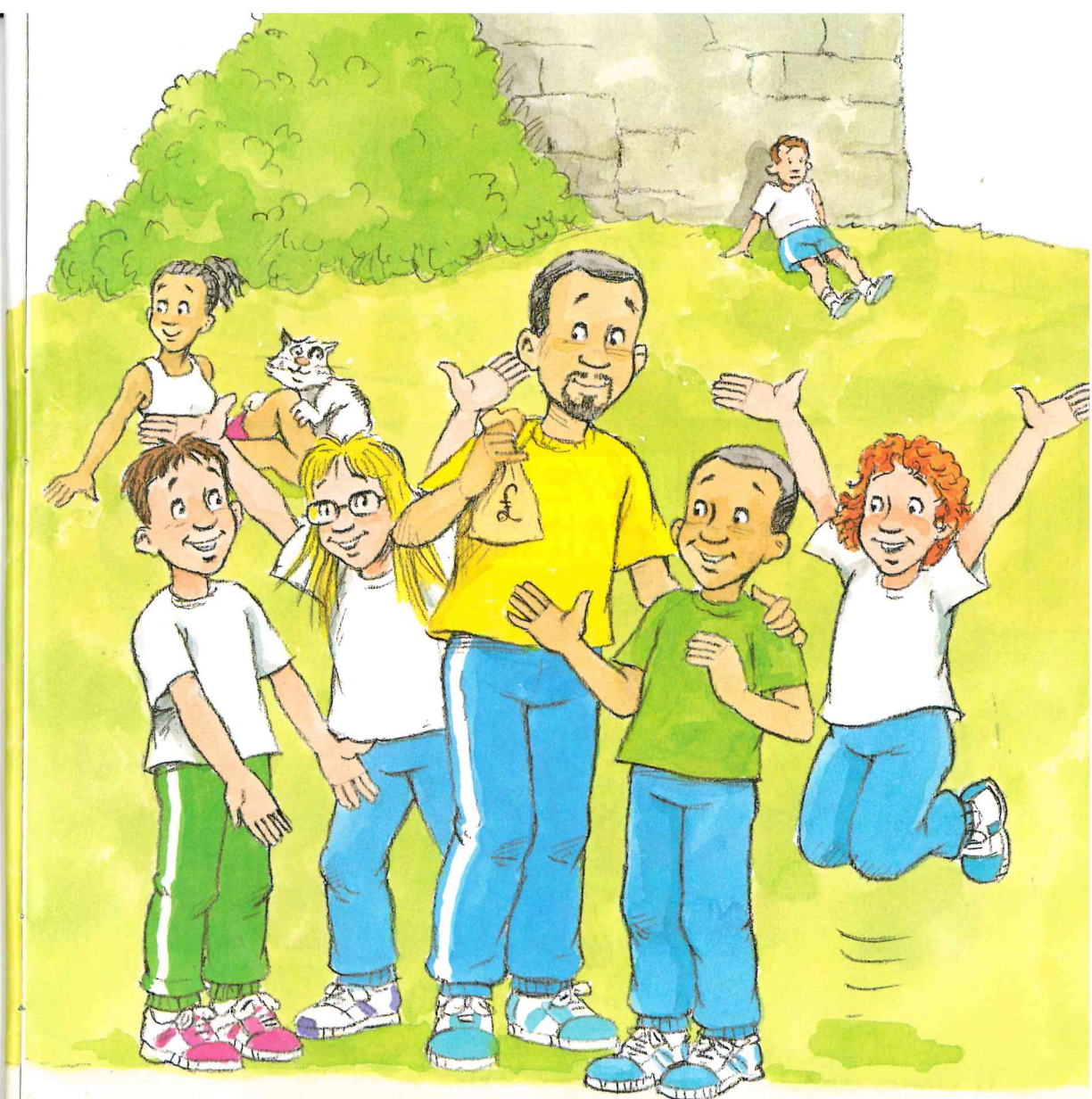
Round and round the park they ran.
