“He just lies in his basket all day. He won’t chase the queen’s cat or bury any bones, and when I throw a stick, he won’t fetch it!” the king said.



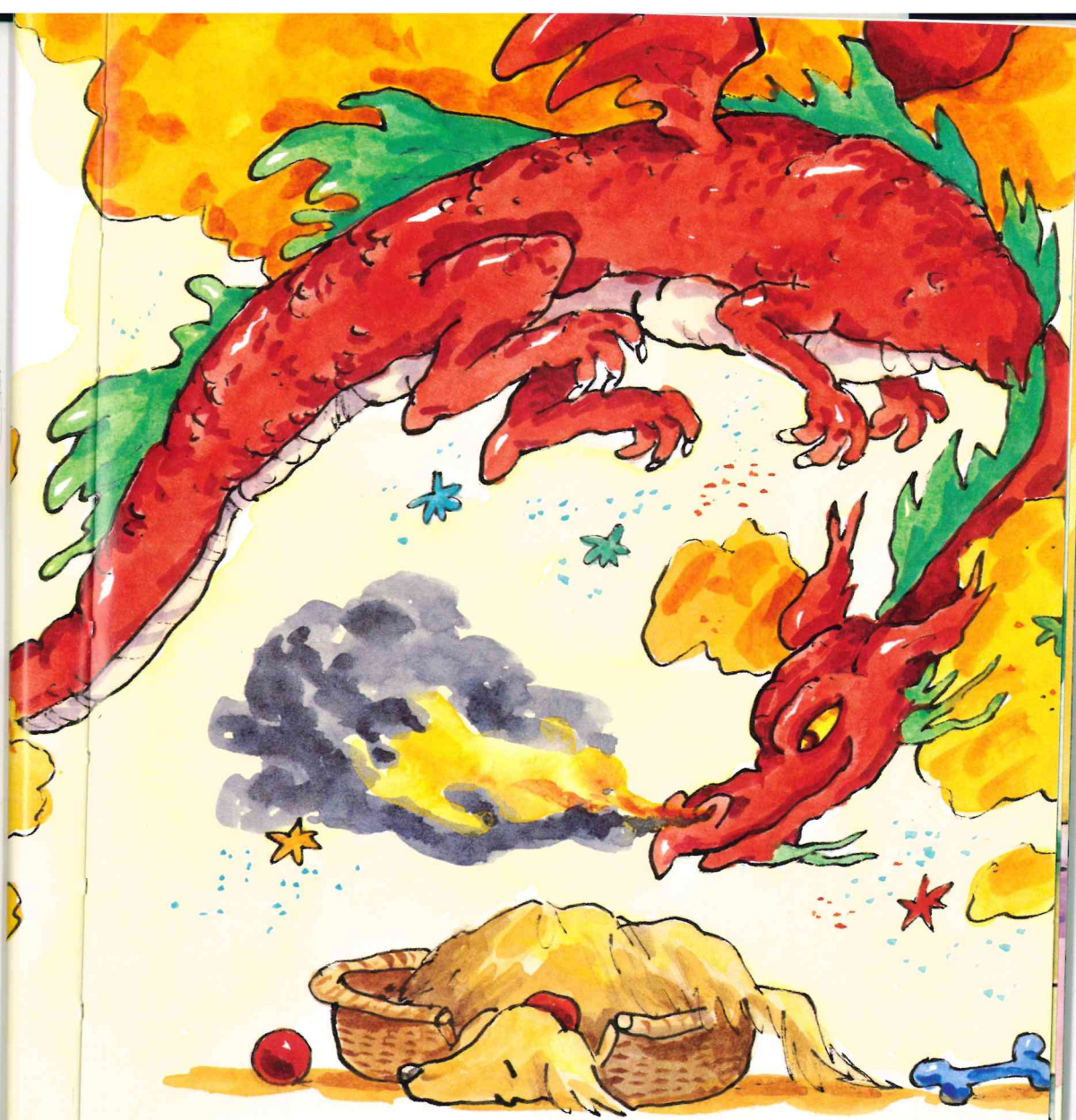
“Maybe I could help to cheer Woof up,” said Wizzle.

Woof put his paws over his eyes.

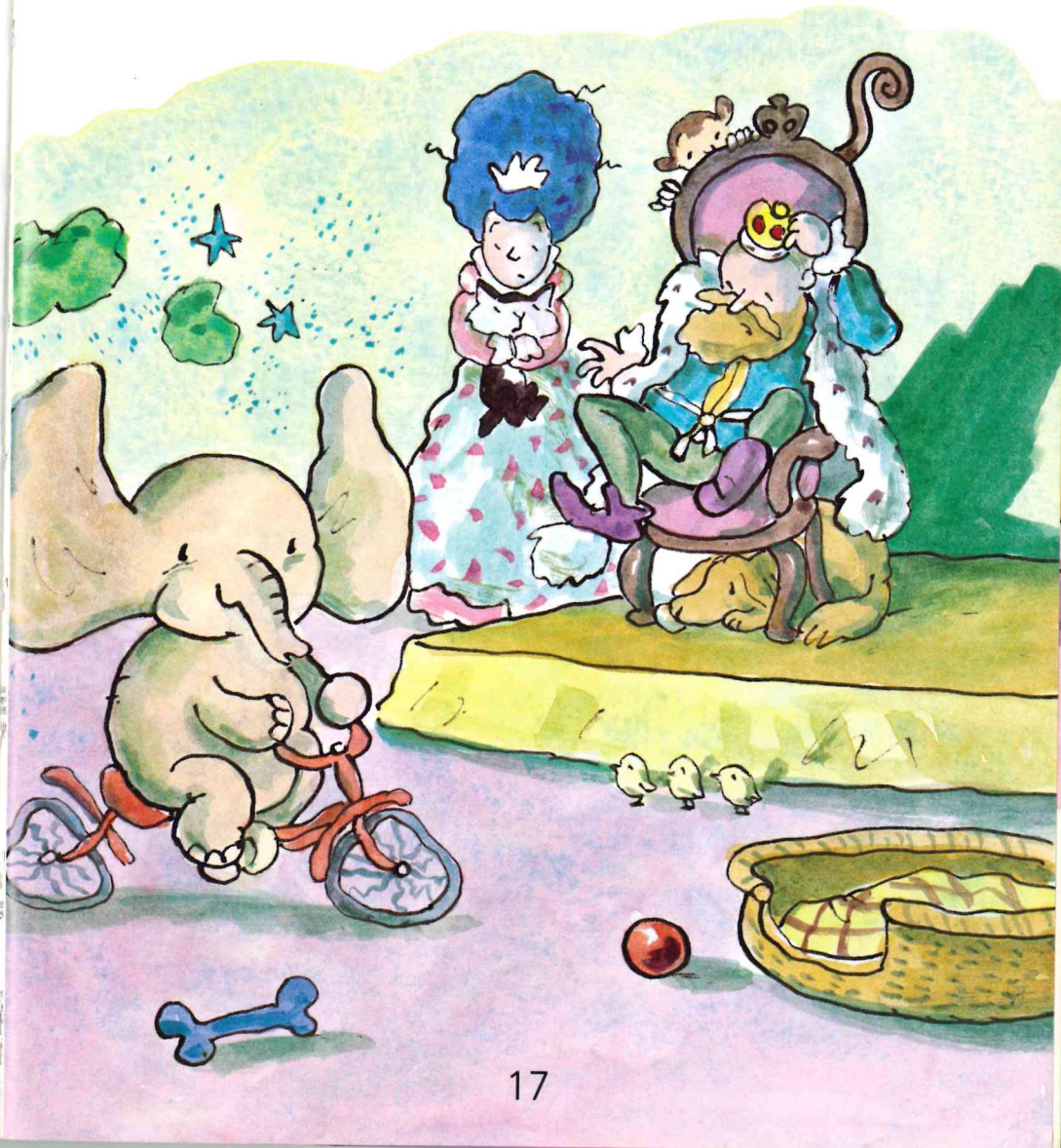


Wanda sighed and went to fetch a jar of Wizzle's magic stones. Wizzle threw some into the air.

and called to Wizzle.



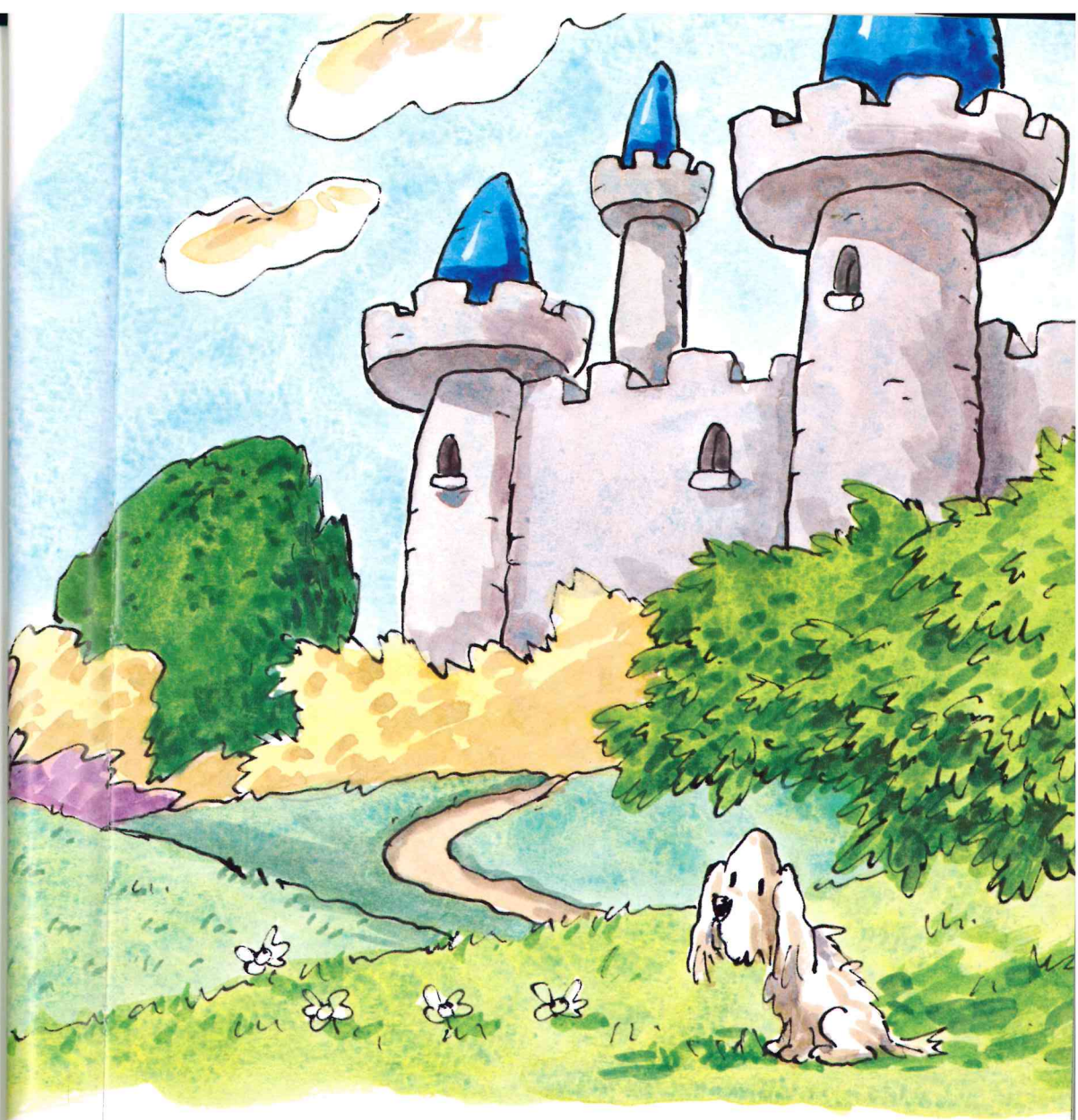
“Don’t worry, I’ll think of a way

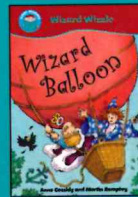
Wizard Woof

There are four **Wizard Wizzle** books.



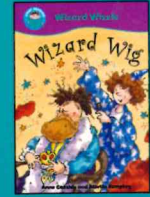

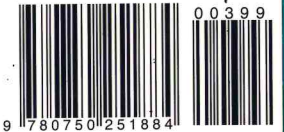
