MESSAGE FROM OUR HEADTEACHERS

Dear Parent/Carer,

Welcome back after a lovely half-term. We hope families were able to relax and enjoy the weather.

As we enter the final half-term of this academic year, we are aware of the need to support our children in developing their ability to cope with change - an important facet of **resilience**.

As adults, we know change is a part of life and we have many strategies to cope with the worries and excitement that we feel at these, but our pupils will still need support in developing these skills.

For our Year Six children, who face the biggest change, we are supporting them with their move to secondary school by discussing secondary schools and giving them the opportunity to ask questions as well as teaching strategies to cope with any worries they might have.

For the rest of the school, change of classes, teachers and year groups can be an equal source of worry and we encourage children to speak with adults in the school to ask questions or raise concerns.

Of course, we also have changes within the school. Last week, we told you that **Mr Ainscow** will be leaving the school to start a new position at a different school. We are also extremely sad to inform you that **Mrs Hamilton-Peck** will be leaving us to work in a school closer to her home. We know that her new school will be enriched by her presence and offer our best wishes for the next step in her career.
