## MESSAGE FROM OUR HEADTEACHERS

Dear Parent/Carer,

This week, the Department for Education (DfE) has published its strategy for schools on how they provide **enrichment** for pupils.

The DfE explain **enrichment** in schools as how schools ensure there is a *wide range of activities and experiences that exist beyond the curriculum, either linked directly to the curriculum (co-curricular), or covering skills, knowledge and activities that work in addition to it (extra-curricular).*

Like all schools, we shall be using this new guidance to review our offer and consider how we can make improvements. However, we are pleased to say that we already provide a great many opportunities outlined as important by the DfE.

For example, schools should provide opportunities for pupils for civic engagement and both our **Future Me** programme and the volunteer roles available in school such as **Sports Leaders** and **Peer Mediators** provide chances for pupils to develop in this area.

Another area of enrichment is by providing **sporting** opportunities. Through our links with the Huntingdonshire Schools Sports Partnership, we send children to netball, tennis, football and even flag football events. Because of this, over 100 different children have taken part in events just this year.

One area where we can develop is in our use of the outdoors and nature to improve learning. This is an area where our links to Meridian Trust will be of immense value as other schools in the Trust have lots of expertise in this area and have already offered their support.
