Dear Future Year Six Parent/Carer

YEAR SIX: ROCK UK RESIDENTIAL TRIP – JULY 2027

We anticipate being able to offer our annual residential trip to ROCK UK Frontier Centre to our upcoming Year Six students in July 2026. This trip has been very successful year after year with pupils, who have taken part.

We are contacting you before the summer holidays to give you advance notice that we will need to request a deposit for this trip on our return in September. We do not yet have final costings, but the price of this year's trip was £305, and we estimate asking for a deposit of £100 early in September.

TRIP DETAILS:

A three day, two night residential trip to ROCK UK Frontier Centre, Irthlingborough. The trip provides children with the opportunity to take part in a range of outdoor activities. The Centre is self-contained and provides excellent facilities and an exciting and challenging activity programme. This trip offers children the important opportunity to gain independence and have fun outside of the normal school setting. ROCK UK also provides good value for money in comparison to similar residential centres.

DATES:

There will be **three** days of activity programmes for the children.

ACTIVITIES:

During the children's stay, they will be given the opportunity to experience a programme of adventure activities, which will be confirmed in a follow-up newsletter. Activities are taught by the Centre's own staff, who hold the relevant teaching and health & safety qualifications. In addition, class teachers lead activities in the evenings, such as a disco. Needless to say, the children's health and safety are paramount throughout the residential.

ACCOMMODATION:

Our accommodation is in bedrooms sleeping two to five children, all with en-suite facilities. Our staff members are accommodated on the same floor as the children. The catering is full board and the Centre's kitchen can cater for any medical dietary requirements.

The Year Six class teachers hope your child chooses to come to The Frontier Centre, as it provides them with wonderful opportunities for his/her self-development and bonding with their peers. Year on year, we see the children flourish on our residential trips, enjoying the activities and time with their friends and teachers.
