Future Me

We are very proud of our Future Me Programme and what our children can achieve through it. This is an innovative and groundbreaking programme that other schools, locally and nationally, are looking to learn from and emulate. Today, we held a Future Me Awards Assembly to finish handing out the final awards from 2024/25 that we were unable to hand out sooner.

Future Me strives to develop, nurture and reward pupil's talents which may at times be hidden. A child spends most of their life outside of school. What they do outside of school has an impact on life in school and vice versa. Therefore, Future Me seeks to recognise the achievements that a child has attained when not at school. This programme also has strong links with the 'world of work' and broadens horizons. In addition, research shows that even very young children may have stereotypical views about the jobs people do based on gender, ethnicity and social background, so we use the programme to promote diversity and challenge stereotypes.

Each child should now have brought home a 2025/26 Future Me booklet, and it is hoped they will take part in and benefit from this strand of our curriculum. We wish for every child to achieve at least a Bronze Award each year and aspire for all children to achieve a Gold Award!
