**Key Stage Two Tests: Year Five and Year Six Briefing**

**KEY STAGE TWO TEST BRIEFING**

**END OF YEAR TEACHER ASSESSMENTS AND TESTS 2025-26**

We would like to invite Year Six and Year Five pupils and parents/carers into school on **Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> November at 3:30pm** for an End of Key Stage Two tests briefing. In the hall, Mr Ainscow and the Year Six Team will be presenting the information in this booklet in a bit more detail. There will be chances for you to ask questions (during and at the end of the session). There will also be some examples of the CGP resources which you may choose to order at a discounted rate. These can be excellent resources to support revision at home.

Before the end of July, the children will be assessed in two ways, via:

1. **A teacher assessment** of writing (including handwriting and spelling)  
*(Teachers judge the level of attainment of each child from evidence seen in lessons, assessments, work, tests etc. against national standards.)*
2. **Tests** in reading (one paper), spelling (one paper), punctuation and grammar (one paper) and maths (an arithmetic paper and two reasoning papers) – during the week **beginning Monday 11<sup>th</sup> May**.

Your child **cannot be assessed as having reached the expected standard in writing** if they cannot spell all the words in the Year Three/Four Word List and almost all the words in the Year Five/Six Word List consistently within their writing on a daily basis. Your child is also expected to correctly use all common words taught throughout their time at school.

During the week beginning **Monday 9<sup>th</sup> March 2025**, the children will likely have their Mock End of Key Stage Two Test Week.

The test week will allow the:

- children the opportunity to experience test conditions before the 'real thing' in May;
- staff the opportunity to identify those areas of the curriculum which children still need to focus on and to find ways in which we can best support your child.

All children sit the same test.

Each maths paper becomes gradually harder.

The reading paper has increasingly harder texts.

The 'Punctuation and Grammar' paper tests each child's understanding of the full range of punctuation, as well as knowledge of the parts of a sentence, such as determiners, adverbials, parenthesis, modal verbs and clauses. Tense choice will also be tested. There will be a focus on grammatical vocabulary. Spellings linked to grammar, such as contractions, may also be assessed.

The spelling test contains twenty random words.

Each child's attainment will be measured using a scaled score. The raw score from the tests will be converted to the scaled score. A score of one hundred will represent the expected standard.

**All tests are marked externally and we have no influence over the marking and grades awarded.**

During the test week, there are various provisions, all of which are used as part of normal classroom practice.

- **Transcription** Staff can transcribe part or all of a paper so that the marker can read what the child has written. Nothing may be added or removed.
- **Scribes** An adult will write for a few of the children. Answers will be dictated by the child; adults cannot add anything.
- **Readers** Some children will have their maths, grammar and punctuation papers read to them (not the reading test). All children will have the spelling test read to them.
- **Additional Time** Children who have an EHCP and those children who have met the criteria will receive extra-time.
- **Prompter** Some children who have severe attention challenges will have a prompter.
- **Rest breaks** Again these are given for those children who have this as part of normal classroom practice.

**If a child requests it**, a question may be read to them. ***(Please encourage your child to ask for assistance should they need it.)*** The staff are unable to give any assistance in explanation, but reading the text aloud often helps – especially if the child is nervous. No text can be read aloud to any child during the reading test.

No child will be given an unfair advantage.

If a child is absent during the week, they will sit the test upon return.

#### What you can do to help your child

Ensure they:

- can spell correctly all the words in the Year Three/Four Word List;
- is supported whilst completing their spelling and other home learning;
- reads **daily** and has opportunities to discuss their reading with an adult;
- knows all the multiplication and division facts up to 12x12 and, if they do not, have opportunities to practise these facts daily such as using the [TTRockstars](#) website;
- regularly visit online learning support and practise areas they find challenging. Speak to the class teacher about extra resources if needed.
- have a normal week. Whether it's sport, music lessons or Scouts and Guides; sticking to your normal routine of out of school activities demonstrates to your child that SATs are not the be all and end all of Year Six.
- stay positive. Many children enjoy taking the tests as they see it as a challenge and like the importance and the feeling of being special that SATs give Year Six.
