## School Readiness at Hatton Park Primary School

### "Teach me to do it myself"

Please support your child by helping them to develop the following skills before starting school.

#### Communication and Language

- Self-confidence to express emotions
- Communicate using full sentences
- During larger group activities, wait your turn to speak
- Ask for help
- Say please and thank you

#### Maths

- Recognise numbers to 10
- Count to 10
- Match some numerals (numbers) to a quantity
- Count items one at a time accurately
- Make repeating patterns with colours,

#### Responsibility for belongings

- Carry own belongings to and from school
- Hang up cardigans, jumpers, coats on pegs
- Undress and dress yourself, including tights and buttons
- Put your shoes on and do them up. Velcro shoes are ideal for Reception children
- Put your coat on and take it off, including zips and buttons

#### <u>Personal hygiene</u>

Blow your own nose and dispose of tissues

#### Toileting

- Wipe yourself
- Flush the toilet


