CODE OF GOOD CONDUCT





Travelling on 'Home to School' transport should be a safe and pleasant experience for everyone. Students are required to adhere to this Code of Good Conduct; students in breach of the Code are liable to receive a sanction. Sanctions vary, dependent on the nature and severity of the incident they can include a warning, a temporary ban or the removal of the students right to travel. Reported incidents of misconduct are investigated jointly by Bedford Borough Council, the school and the transport operator. Where a ban from transport is enforced, it is the parent/carer's responsibility to ensure a student's continued attendance at school.

The following is a guide to good behaviour; the guide should not be considered exhaustive.

- Arrive at the designated bus stop at least 5 minutes before the scheduled departure and behave appropriately whilst waiting.
- Wait until the bus stops before trying to board or alight the vehicle.
- You must have your bus pass ready to show the driver each time you travel.
- Be polite and courteous to the driver and treat other passengers with respect.
- Whilst travelling remain seated at all times, wear a seatbelt if one is available, do not stand on stairways or the platform and do not obstruct others.
- Store your belongings in a safe place do not block the gangway.
- Comply with safety instructions given by the driver and/or passenger assistant.
- Do not distract the driver.
- Do not tamper with emergency exits or windows.
- Do not throw things around or out of the bus.
- Smoking (including e-cigarettes/vapes), eating or drinking are not permitted.
- Bullying, vandalism, bad language and unruly behaviour will not be tolerated and could lead to the removal of your right to transport.
- Leave the bus clean and tidy and ensure you have all your belongings.
- Report any issues that you witness to the driver / passenger assistant or member of school / college staff
- Bedford Borough Council reserves the right to issue warnings and/or bans to students whose behaviour is deemed to put themselves/others at risk or cause offence.

BREACHES OF THE CODE OF GOOD CONDUCT

FOR STUDENTS TRAVELLING TO MAINSTREAM SCHOOLS & COLLEGES



Incidents of misconduct are investigated jointly by the Council, the school & the transport operator.

The Council separates incidents of misconduct into 3 categories, dependent on their nature and severity. The categories are listed below together with some examples of misconduct; the lists should not be considered exhaustive.

CATEGORIES OF MISCONDUCT

1. Unacceptable Behaviour

- Failure to show a valid bus pass to the driver.
- Eating or drinking on the bus (unless permission has been given).
- Smoking (including e-cigarettes/vapes)
- Using offensive language.
- Disobeying an instruction given by the driver and/or passenger assistant.
- Littering the vehicle or any form of vandalism to property.

2. Dangerous Behaviour

- Refusing to remain seated whilst the vehicle is in motion.
- Distracting the driver with persistent noise.
- Inappropriate use of the stop bell.
- Bullying, threatening or verbally harassing passengers or members of the public.
- Not wearing safety belt, where provided
- Pushing or shoving when boarding or exiting the bus

3. Life-threatening, Dangerous & Destructive Behaviour

- Throwing objects that could cause potential harm or damage.
- Damage or serious vandalism to the bus (seats, windows, seatbelts etc).
- Physically attacking the driver or other passengers.
- Lighting a fire on the bus, including inappropriate use of aerosols.
- Interfering with the mechanical operation of the bus.
- Intentionally reckless actions.
- Repeated occurrences of 'Category 2 Dangerous Behaviour'

N.B. Where the operator wishes to pursue costs for damage incurred; the parent/carer would be liable.

STUDENTS FAILING TO ADHERE TO THE CODE OF GOOD CONDUCT WILL BE ISSUED A SANCTION.

EXAMPLES OF SANCTIONS THAT MAY BE ISSUED AT THE DISCRETION OF BEDFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL.

Written Warning	Three Day Ban
One Week Ban	One Month Ban
One Term Ban	Permanent Ban

N.B the school may also elect to directly enforce a sanction via an alternative method, i.e. detention, isolation or exclusion
