GCSE Geography Field Trip to Iceland February 2027

Dear Parent/Carer,

The Geography Department are very pleased to offer a residential field trip to Iceland for our current Year 9 students for 2027. This trip is entirely optional and will aim to run from Thursday 11 February to Monday 15 February 2027 depending on which flights we can secure. We are hoping for 40 students to join us and at this stage, we are simply asking you to register your interest so we can understand if the trip is viable.

| Estimated cost to each Pupil | In the region of £1,600 per student |
| Method/Timing of payments | If the trip is viable, a monthly payment plan will be set up. |
| Departure date & time | Thursday 11 February 2027 – times tbc |
| Return date & time | Monday 15 February 2027 – times tbc |
| Duration | Five days / four nights |

This is a phenomenal opportunity to study the 'Land of Fire and Ice', a living laboratory which sits astride the Mid-Atlantic ridge with exceptionally diverse landscapes of fjords, glaciers and active volcanic landforms all wrapped up in a centuries old Norse culture. Iceland is a 'must see' location for all geographers, a place where one can swim in geothermal waters, stand on a moving glacier, observe an active volcano and bubbling geysers, walk across a desert and marvel at a black sand beach - all in one day!

As part of their GCSE course, students study natural hazards, plate tectonics, weather and climate, glaciation, geomorphic processes, coasts, urban environments, energy and sustainability. All of these topics (amongst others) have very strong and clear links to the country of Iceland and a visit there is certain to provide invaluable additional knowledge to help support GCSE study. The trip itself also hopes to inspire students to explore the world around them and give them a greater appreciation of the diversity of its people and places.

Whilst the final itinerary is yet to be finalised, the cost will include:

- Return airport transfers and flights to Iceland
- Accommodation for 4 nights
- Meals including eating at local restaurants. There is a possibility that one lunch may need to be purchased.
- All coach travel around Iceland
- A personal tour guide
- All activities (and any specialist equipment required) which we hope would include a glacier walk, the Golden Circle Day Excursion, South Shore Day Excursion, entry to Perlan exhibition centre, entry to one of the geothermal pools and entrance to a geothermal power plant. Final itinerary TBC.
- Trip insurance

Please note that we are extremely appreciative as to how expensive this trip might appear.
