Mobile phones

Mobile phones must not be seen or heard at Lincroft Academy, as outlined in section 3.6 of our behaviour policy. Students may have their phones switched off in their bag, but phones must not be seen, heard or used on our school site, including before and after school. If a student needs to contact home during the school day, they can visit their house office at break or lunch time and staff will facilitate a phone call, where appropriate. We are reminding students that they must not carry their phone in their pockets or on their person; it must be in their bag. Phones can cause safeguarding concern and, additionally, can provide distraction and disruption to learning. In an exam, possession of a mobile phone is malpractice and can lead to disqualification. Please support us to promote good habits in school by reiterating these messages at home.
