Information from our Safeguarding Team: Healthy & Safe Relationships

Positive relationships help children feel confident, included and valued. They are still learning about personal boundaries, fairness, empathy and consent — all key elements of safe friendships. We teach children that healthy relationships make us feel good about ourselves, and that everyone has the right to be treated with kindness and respect. If something doesn't feel safe or kind, children should always tell a trusted adult.

Parent/Carers can support by:

- Talking about what makes a friendship safe and supportive
- Helping children recognise warning signs such as pressure, put-downs or exclusion







































- Reinforce that it's okay to say "no" or ask for space
- Celebrate compassionate and fair behaviour at home and school
