



PUPIL PREMIUM CHARTER

We have made a commitment to design a curriculum, that prepares our pupils for adulthood (SEND COP (2015), closing both the academic and experiences gap for all pupils and especially for those who are disadvantaged.

INDEPENDENT LIVING



Fostering independence

Each pupil will be supported to foster independent learning, increased self-efficacy, and independent living through:

- Access to targeted 'My Wellbeing and My Next Steps' sessions, in response to each pupil's needs.
- Access to targeted interventions across all four areas of SEND.

BEING HEALTHY



Mentoring and support

Each pupil will be provided with personalised mentoring that meets their needs through:

- Having three dedicated 'My Voyage' interviews each year.
- Accessing a multi-disciplinary review, at least once per Key Stage.

PREPARING FOR HIGHER EDUCATION/ EMPLOYMENT



CEIAG

Each pupil will have an understanding of the progression routes and opportunities available to them in preparation for employment / higher education:

- Attending a minimum of two interviews with an independent careers advisor.
- Accessing appropriate and meaningful employer encounters.
- Completing an aspirational work experience placement, appropriate to need.

PARTICIPATING IN SOCIETY



Experiences & Enrichment

Each pupil will have memorable experiences that will support engagement and grow independence through:

- Support in school to achieve at least their Silver PLEDGES award before the end of Year 11.
- Access to an appropriate number of Learning Outside the Classroom experiences each year, determined by curriculum pathway.
- Support in school to achieve at least 50 of the '99 things' by the time they finish Year 11.
