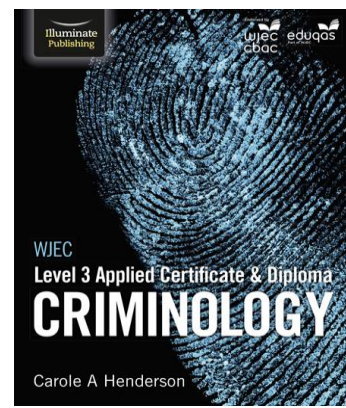
## Course Content

## Assessment

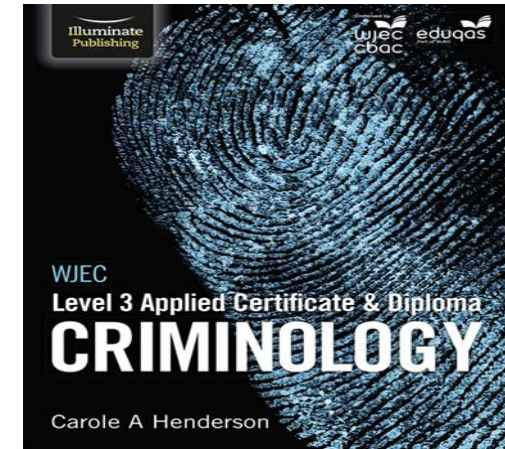
