

As senior students the sixth form are expected to look smart and dress appropriately; this includes hairstyles and choice of hair colour. The tables below provide guidance as to what is and is not acceptable wear for sixth form. Sixth Form lanyards must be worn at all times.

Acceptable dress code

Smart / formal dresses, skirts (knee length), suit and shirt with or without tie, smart trousers or chinos
Smart top, blouse, shirt (plain or patterned, short or long sleeved) or polo shirt
Cardigans, jumpers, waistcoats
Smart/tailored jackets
Religious headwear/scarves
Smart shoes, boots or sandals
Discreet Jewellery
(Summer term only – Easter Holiday to July) Students may wear plain coloured, knee-length, smart, tailored shorts. They should not be denim, or be considered as beach wear, such as Hawaiian or swim shorts. The wearing of tailored shorts does not mean students can wear trainers and all other dress code requirements still apply.

Students on POSH and Salon courses will have a subject dress code that must be adhered to and is an expectation for your place on that course. Leggings are acceptable for salon students when wearing their salon tunics. These students are still expected to wear a lanyard at all times.

The smart dress code means that the following items of clothing are not considered acceptable dress code. If worn, the issue will be addressed, and appropriate action taken by staff. This might mean students are given appropriate clothing to wear, sent home to change or have a parent/carer bring in something that is suitable.

Unacceptable dress code

Jogging trousers or any sports clothes except when instructed for PE or Sport lessons
Jeans, Leggings and jeggings, shorts, short skirts (skirts must be to the knee minimum)

Hoodies and sweatshirts
Vest tops, strappy/strapless/off shoulder/sheer/low cut tops/crop tops. Denim shirts or jackets
Collarless T-shirts
Hats indoors
Trainers, Canvas shoes
No obvious facial piercings (including earlobe stretchers) except for one nose stud or ring. No septum piercings
