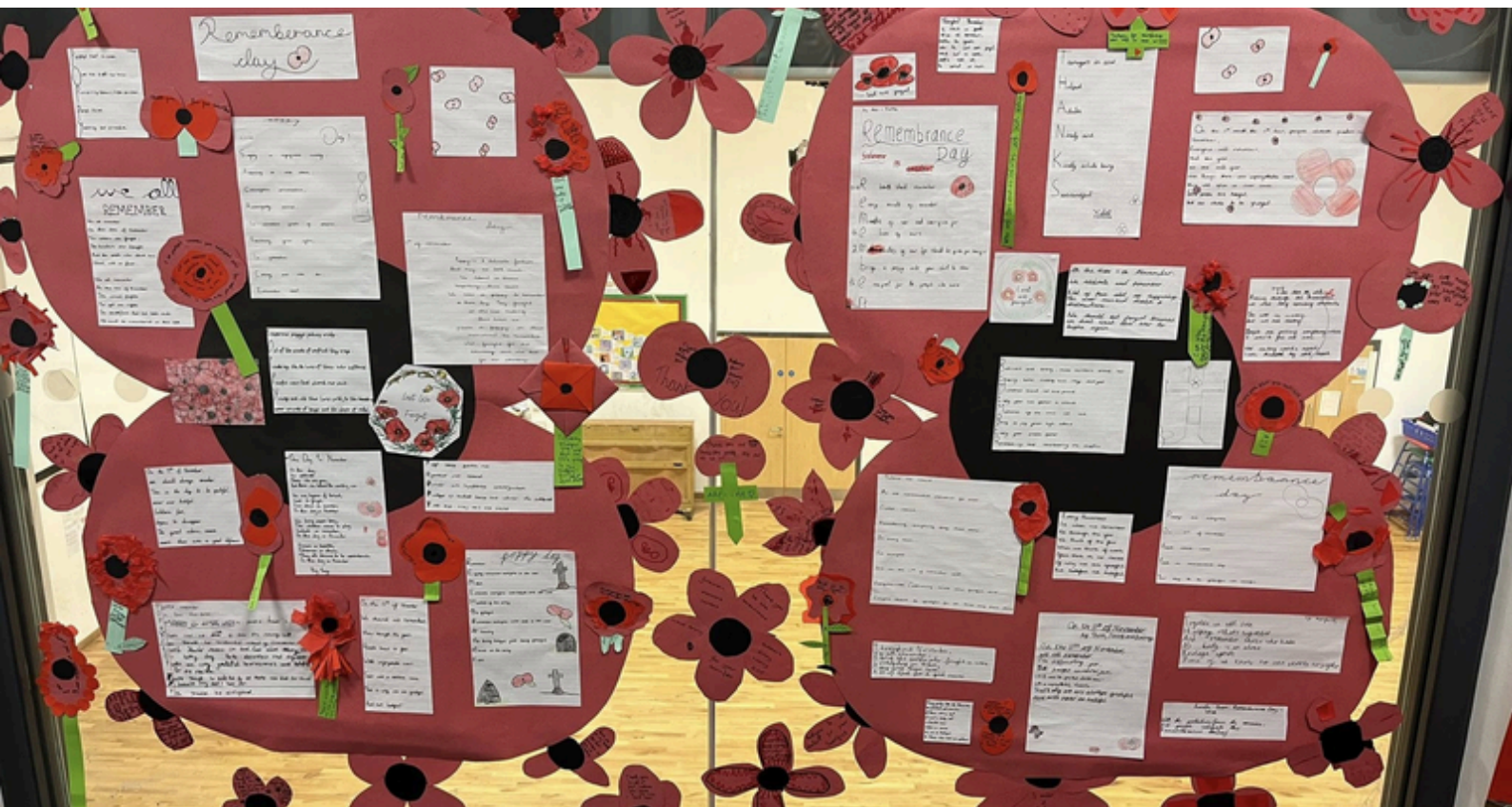

Cross Country Success

On Wednesday, we took a team of 48 children to Wimpole Hall to run in the annual South Cambridgeshire Cross Country Championships. All our children performed brilliantly and represented the school, clearly demonstrating all the PARK values.

With 23 schools and over 1000 children participating, competition was fierce with over 120 children in each race and it could have been quite daunting for some of our younger children. Despite this, the children all gave of their very best with 23 children finishing in the top 20 of their races, 14 top ten finishers and 5 medalists. Particular congratulations to Danny (Year 5) and Sophie (Year 3) for winning their respective races and to Lucia (Year 3) for coming a very close second in her race. Undoubtedly the race of the day was the Year 6 girls' race in which less than a metre separated Ataiah and Poppy at the end with them finishing in first and second places respectively with Bella coming in close behind in fourth place. Phenomenal effort girls!

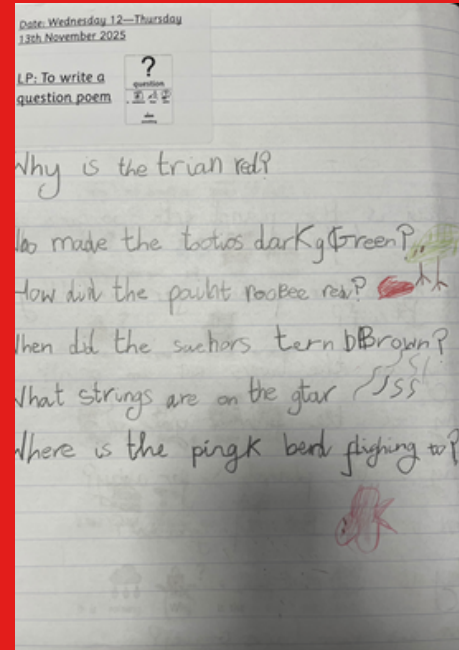
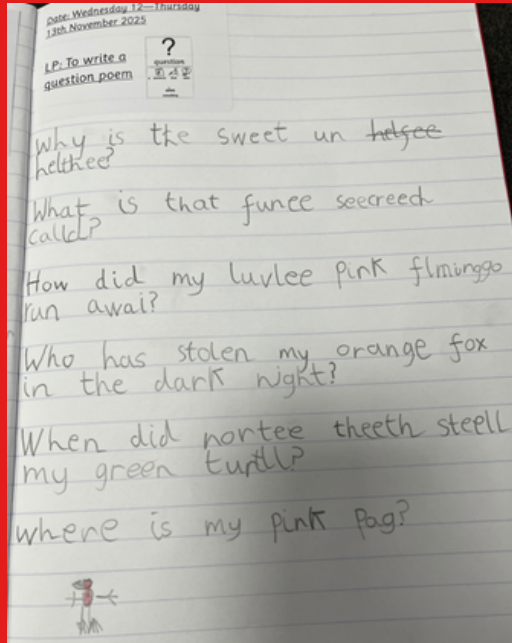
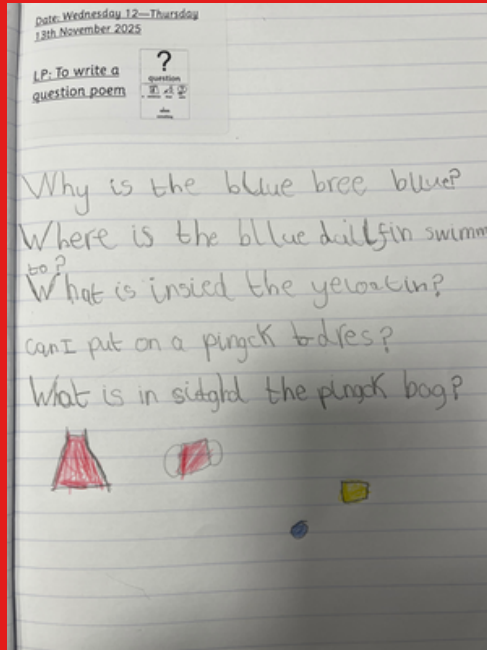

News from the classes

In Reception, this week the children walked up the road for their very first Forest session. They showed fantastic independence in putting on the wet suits before heading up. My goodness they really needed them as it poured down! Despite this all the children had a fantastic time, behaved brilliantly and can't wait to go up again.

In Key Stage 1, this week children have created their own poems using colour questions based on the Christina Rossetti poem 'What is Pink?' The children have come up with so many great ideas and questions based on colour and have used a wide range of different questions words to create some fantastic writing. In Year 3, the children have really impressed Miss Williams and Mrs Stacey this week with their maths work. The children have been looking at column subtraction with double exchange which is every bit as difficult as it sounds! Mr Wilson, Mr Wilkinson and Mrs Watson have been delighted by the poetry that Year 4 have produced using Autumn as a stimulus.

Year 5 have produced some stunning poetry this week based on their current text 'Asha and the Spirit Bird'. (see some wonderful examples further down the newsletter) The children had to write evocative accounts of what it would be like to walk around an Indian market, thinking about all their senses. The children used wonderful imagery, ambitious word choices and super adjectives to create some amazing pieces of work. Next week Year 5 parents will have the opportunity to read them when they come in for our showcase assembly and walkround.

Incredible India

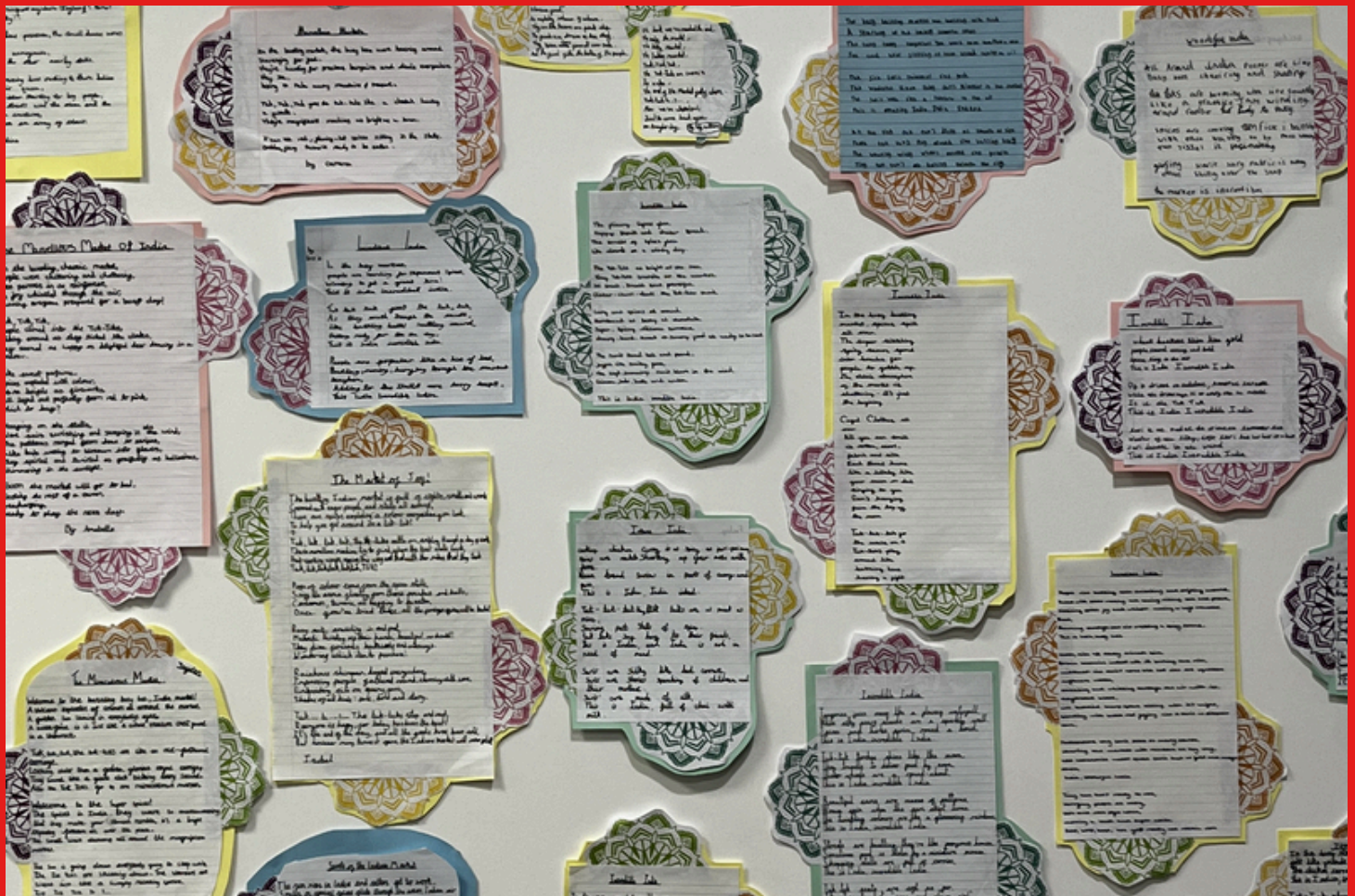
In the busy bustling
