The Academy Identity

The Academy brand was chosen and created by our students and wider community when we joined Meridian Trust.

The logo is inspired by organic shapes found in nature to reflect our rural setting. The overall triangular shape evokes an oak tree.

House System

Sawtry Village Academy has four main school Houses and one 6th form House:

The Houses provide crucial support and guidance, and the needs of every student are acknowledged and understood by their tutor and senior tutor. The system enables individual progress to be monitored much more closely and the House is the key focus of the relationship between the Academy and families, with siblings joining the same House.

The House offices are a great base for students and parents to find the support and assistance they may need. Each house has a dedicated

member of the leadership team, a senior tutor and a student support advisor.

House teams work closely with families, teachers and SEND Department (Willow) to ensure that students with special educational needs and/or disabilities are adequately supported. All students are encouraged to play active roles in school community. We are proud of our inclusive ethos and strive to develop the sense of belonging and empowerment in all students.

Vertical Tutoring

The mixed aged tutor group system is known as Vertical Tutoring. Each tutor group will have a mixture of students from Years 7-11. The sixth form has a specialist team.

The Vertical Tutoring system has many benefits, fostering a family spirit where older students offer guidance and provide support to younger students. It also ensures students have a sense of the whole school picture as the younger students see the older ones preparing for work experience, subject choices and important examinations.

The tutors will follow the students from their first few days to their last at the Academy. This allows them to easily build great relationships with students and their families and ensure they receive the support they need. Each tutor will make regular contact with a child's family in the year to discuss progress and address any concerns.

An encouraging House ethos for students to strive in is developed and strengthened by healthy competition. Students will have the opportunity to compete alongside their House peers in a variety of activities in order to claim victory and win the prestigious House Award.

House System

We believe in an all-inclusive education where every student not only develops academic skills, but also self-confidence, life-skills, and leadership experiences.

In addition to the Pledge programme, there is a wide-range of other whole Academy activities, including:

- ▶ Inter-House competitions
- ▶ Charity events
- ▶ Extended curriculum days
- ▶ Educational visits and experiences

There are student leadership opportunities to be found throughout all aspects of Academy life – from the informal leadership that is inherent in the mixed age tutor groups, through to the Academy House Captains, and local and national representative groups.

Curriculum Structure: Key Stage 3 (KS3)

Students in Years 7 and 8 (Key Stage 3) will study the following subjects:

- ▶ English
- ▶ Mathematics
- ▶ Physical Education
- ▶ Science
- ▶ Creative Arts and Drama
- ▶ Humanities (Geography & History)
- ▶ Modern Foreign Languages (French or Spanish)
- ▶ Technology (covering aspects such as Food, Graphics, Media, Photography, Resistant Materials and Textiles)
- ▶ Core Studies covers Religious Education, Citizenship, Personal Development, Careers Information, Advice and Guidance

Curriculum Structure: Key Stage 4 (KS4)

All students in KS4 work towards external examinations in all subjects with the exception of Physical Education.

Students in Years 9, 10 and 11 have some degree of choice but all students will study:

- ▶ English
- ▶ Mathematics
- ▶ Science
- ▶ Physical Education
- ▶ Humanities (Geography & History)
- ▶ Core studies which includes Religious Education, Personal Development, Careers, Information, Advice and Guidance

There will be a guided choice based on current government and Ofsted recommendations and sound careers and progression advice. This will include consideration of the significance of an English Baccalaureate route and imposition for some students.

Session 6

Sawtry Village Academy offers a wide variety of extra-curricular opportunities through a timetabled programme over the year. These encompass activities such as sports, encore, music and additional subject support.

The Academy day extends to 4.00pm for those students who wish to stay for after-school activities or additional curriculum assistance – these sessions are called Session 6.

Teachers will recommend sessions that will be useful if a student needs additional support or clarification. Students can also drop into extra-curricular sessions themselves if they are feeling overwhelmed or need assistance.

Academy Rewards

Sawtry Village Academy takes great pride in celebrating and sharing the achievements of its students and staff. We have a comprehensive protocol of rewarding students in lessons through a credit system which recognises hard work, persistence and participation in learning. These credits can be achieved at bronze, silver, gold and diamond level.

Students can be presented with "I've Been Great Rewards" by any member of staff in the Academy. These rewards are presented to students who go above and beyond expectations. For example, this could be to recognise a student supporting another student without being asked. Quite simply we try, wherever possible, to celebrate positive action and behaviours every day.

We have an uncompromising commitment to ensure that every child achieves their academic potential at Sawtry Village Academy. Our curriculum has been carefully designed to secure the best possible outcomes for our students. We also have systems in place for students that need extra support and guidance to achieve.

In order to support our challenging curriculum, we have also developed and invested in a simple but broad set of Academy Pledges. Pledges are an awards system which offer students a range of character-building opportunities that enhance their learning and development.

The Pledges system aims to encourage and reward the development of many important qualities in students, such as responsibility, expectation, intuition and citizenship, all of which are crucial for giving students skills and brighter futures.

Sawtry Village Academy is a valued member of the wider community and a source of immense pride.

Drawing upon the village college roots of the Trust, we firmly believe our role is to provide for all members of the community we serve. This means that we open the Academy's facilities to the community and support local events such as the Feast Supper and Sawtry Carnival. In addition, we offer facilities for hire and a programme of Leisure Learning classes in the evenings.
