

The PLEDGES Programme



PLEDGES is an awards system which offers students a range of character building opportunities that enhance their learning and development.



The PLEDGES system aims to encourage and support many important qualities in students such as leadership, citizenship, moral purpose , sense of community and collective responsibility. Many of the PLEDGES criteria have at their core the British Values of;

Democracy,

The rule of law,

Individual Liberty,

Mutual Respect and Tolerance.

To ensure all students gain the award they will be supported through school activities and tutor discussion but the onus is on the student to ensure all sections of the PLEDGES are complete. Parents will be made aware of their child's progress through the regular written reporting cycle.

In the coming years we would like you to achieve, as a minimum, your Bronze PLEDGE by year 8 and your silver PLEDGE by the end of year 11. If you do achieve both PLEDGES then please try to go for the Gold PLEDGE.


This page is to help you identify which PLEDGE you are going to achieve when you commit
