

Home Learning

At Stratton school we aim to ensure our students get the most from their education and high-quality home learning plays an important role in this. Home learning provides several positive outcomes for students;

- Providing opportunities for practise and consolidation of learnt material
- Preparing for future lessons and assessments
- Encouraging independent learning and study

The school uses 'Bromcom' to set all home learning tasks, which means parents and students can access and monitor this through MyChildAtSchool (MCAS).

Whilst there is no blanket policy on home learning, it will be set frequently. In core subjects it will be set on a weekly basis, as students have more lessons per week in these subjects. In Sixth Form, the amount of work students will undertake independently and outside of lesson time will increase considerably, where students are expected to complete as many hours independently, as they have timetabled lessons. Subjects requiring coursework will also be completed outside of lesson time.

At Stratton school we believe in a shared responsibility when it comes to home learning:

Teachers will...

- Ensure home learning activities are accessible to all students (Bromcom)
- Provide appropriate feedback
- Reward students for excellent efforts in home learning
- Monitor and apply appropriate sanctions for lack of completion of home learning

Parents should...

- Help their child plan and organise their home learning including being able to access MCAS
- Where possible, provide a suitable learning environment for completion *
- Encourage positive conversations about their child's home learning

Students should...

- Be responsible and check Bromcom/MCAS for the home learning which has been set each day
- Complete home learning work to the best of their effort and ability

*The school provides a weekly home learning provision for students who cannot complete home learning tasks outside of school.
