It has been another fantastic week at Trumpington Park Primary School, and we are incredibly proud of our children and staff across the school. There has been a real sense of energy and commitment in classrooms, with children working hard and showing a positive attitude towards their learning.

Year 1 have been doing amazing work in phonics, continuing to build their confidence and fluency in reading. It has been wonderful to see how much progress they are making, with children applying their knowledge with increasing independence. The enthusiasm they bring to their sessions is a real credit to them, and we are equally proud of the staff who support them so effectively.

In Year 2, the children have been writing inspired by the beautiful picture book *The Umbrella*. Their work has shown great imagination and care, with thoughtful vocabulary choices and developing writing skills. It has been lovely to see how engaged they have been with the text and how they have used it as a springboard for their own ideas.

We are also getting ready for our Art Showcase, which is always a special event in our school calendar. The anticipation is building, and it is a joy to see the creativity and effort that children are putting into their work. We are always so proud of how our children express themselves through art and how confidently they represent the school.

In Year 3, Zoe shared that there has been lots of work on spelling and reading. The children have been practising regularly and showing determination to improve, and it is clear that this focus is having a positive impact. These key skills are so important, and it is great to see such strong effort from the class.

Year 4 have been very busy with their maths, approaching their learning with focus and resilience. They have been tackling challenges with confidence and demonstrating a good understanding of key concepts. Alongside this, they have also been exploring their creativity through shadow puppets. This has been a particularly engaging project, and we encourage you to check out our Facebook page to see more of what they have been doing.

Year 5 enjoyed a fantastic trip to Byron's Pool, where they explored the river as part of their geography learning. Experiences like this really help to bring classroom learning to life, and the children embraced the opportunity to observe and explore their local environment. It was a valuable and enjoyable visit that will no doubt support their ongoing learning.

In Year 6, there has been a strong focus on both art and performance. The children have been creating self-portraits, showing great care and attention to detail, and producing some striking pieces of work. At the same time, play practice is well underway, with children showing enthusiasm and teamwork as they prepare for their upcoming performance. We are looking forward to seeing it all come together.

We are now looking ahead to Key Stage 2 Sports Day next Wednesday, which is always a highlight for the children. We hope to see many of you there supporting and cheering them on as they take part.


