
## Year 3/4 Autumn Term Curriculum 2025

## Cooking and Nutrition – A balanced diet Design and In this unit of cooking and nutrition, the children will expand their knowledge of healthy eating by Technology (DT) designing and making their own healthy pizza. They will look at the nutritional values of ingredients used to make a pizza and develop their grating and chopping skills. <u>Invasion Games – Handball (Y3); Taq Ruqby (Y4):</u> The children will develop their passing and moving Physical skills to keep possession and develop this concept into mini game situations. Education Gymnastics - Symmetry & Asymmetry (Y3); Bridges (Y4): focusing on exploring and applying the 3 principles of balance: contact points, surface area and centre of gravity. (PE) Outdoor Adventurous Activities (Orienteering (Y3); Problem Solving (Y4): developing teamwork, problem-solving skills and coordination and orientation in an outdoor environment. Inclusion Games – Boccia (Y3 only): throwing close to a target and developing strategies. Swimming – Year 3 only: developing confidence in the water, working towards swimming 25m. Dance - Year 4 only: teachers will work with the class to plan, develop, choregraph and perform a dance linked to an area of our wider curriculum. Computing Systems and Networks Computing During this unit, the children will learn about the internet, including how it works, how to use it safely and how to find information online. Creating Media The children will use a range of techniques to create a stop-frame animation and will apply those skills to create a story-based animation. Music in Britian since 1930 Music In Music, the children will identify the changes in musical styles in Britain from the 1930's. They will explore popular songs and investigate how melodies can move by steps and leaps. They will learn to use the words conjunct and disjunct to describe the shapes of melodies. Personal Social This unit will help develop children's understanding and recognition of their own emotions and those **Health Education** of others, including how we might express those feelings. It builds on the work done in the equivalent unit for Years 1 and 2 and the children will identify an increasing range of emotions, developing a (PSHE) language to describe them, and consider what prompts different feelings in themselves and others. In this unit children will develop their understanding of the key characteristics of bullying and develop, explore and apply definitions of bullying to a range of situations including cyberbullying. The theme of anti-bullying will be addressed throughout the year, but with a particular focus during Anti-Bullying Week (Monday 13th - Friday 17th November). World Views Why do people tell creation stories? Do we still need them? Creation stories fulfil the human need to answer the questions, 'Where have we come from?' and 'Why are we here?'. In this unit we will investigate a wide variety of ideas about creation, including scientific theories, origin stories of the Heiltsuk people of NW Canada and the creation stories in the Abrahamic and Hindu faiths. We will ask, "Are these stories literal or symbolic?" Symbols of faith — what do they mean to British people today? This unit looks at signs and symbols through the lenses of two organised worldviews which both hold important festivals in the autumn and winter – Hinduism and Christianity. We will find out about the symbolism of Hindu murtis and how, for many people, these show different aspects of the one Supreme Being. We will also look at some of the symbols used in Christianity. We will then research diversity in how people celebrate both Divali and Christmas This term in French, <u>Year 3</u> will be getting to know France and learning how to introduce themselves Languages in short conversation. Then they will move on to learning colours and simple adjectives, through art In French, Year 4 will begin by thinking all about Our Year, including days, months, dates and birthday celebrations. After half term, they will look at Le Petit Chaperon Rouge (Little Red Riding Hood) and complete activities related to the story.
