


SEND NEWSLETTER

It has been a great start to the new school year and we hope all our pupils are proud of all their achievements so far this term. Within the SEND team here at Woodston Primary we have said goodbye to Mrs Tomlin who has switched to being the SENCO at a different school in the Trust, Nene Valley Primary. All year groups will now be supported by Mrs Robinson.

We hope that you were able to attend our parent teacher consultation evenings this week and hear updates on how your child is getting along this year. Teachers have also reviewed the Learning Plans for those on the SEND register and have shared those with parents this week. If you have not received a copy this week please do ask your child's class teacher for one. In the second week back from the break teachers will be producing the next Learning Plan for your child. This will outline their targets for the new cycle and what provision will be in place in school.

We are pleased to share that we are welcoming some additional Teaching Assistants to our staff team this term. As a school we are continuing to prioritise progress in reading for our pupils and many of our Teaching Assistants are involved in delivering phonics and reading groups in the afternoons across this term. This includes a brand new reading programme for a group of pupils in Years 3 and 4 which we are sure they will enjoy. All of our teachers are happy to chat with you about how to support your child's reading skills if you have any questions.

PINS project: Free Webinars for Parents and Carers

We are pleased to share there are some upcoming events for parents and carers as part of our involvement in the PINS project. The Partnership for Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS) project brings together a number of schools in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough to explore the ways in which pupils who are neurodiverse can be supported in mainstream primary schools. There are two free online webinars for parents and carers on **Wednesday 5th November** covering toileting, eating and sleeping difficulties in children. Choice of 9:30-11:30Am or 17:30-19:30 slot. These will be delivered by local health professionals with a short Q & A session at the end. This is hosted by the charity Family Voice and can be booked directly with them via the QR code.
